CHAPTER 65

AN ACT

[H. B. 77]

Placing a Bounty on all eagles in the Territory of Alaska, providing certain regulations, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. A bounty of Two Dollars (\$2.00), is hereby placed upon every eagle in the Territory of Alaska, said sum to be paid in accordance with the following provisions of this Act.

Section 2. To obtain such bounty, any person killing an eagle within the Territory of Alaska, shall, as soon as possible, exhibit both feet of said eagle to any United States Commissioner within the Territory, together with a certificate in substantially the following form:

the bounty of two dollars (\$2.00) for each eagle under the laws of Alaska, totalling \$.....

I,, a United States Commissioner in the Territory of Alaska, residing at, Alaska, certify that on this day of, 19...., at, Alaska, personally appeared before me the above named, who signed the foregoing statement in my presence and exhibited the feet of eagles to me, and to the best of my knowledge and belief the said is justly entitled to the bounty of two dollars (\$2.00) for each of said eagles so provided by law.

Section 3. In the presence of the United States Commissioner, after obtaining the United States Commissioner's signature to the above certificate, the person making the above certificate shall enclose the same in an envelope and together with both feet of the eagle or eagles so killed shall mail the same to the Treasurer of the Territory at Juneau, Alaska. Upon receipt of such certificate duly signed and accompanied by both feet of the eagle or eagles so killed, the Treasurer shall forward the amount due to the person so killing said eagle or eagles.

Section 4. Any person making false certificate for the purpose of fraudulently obtaining any money from the Treasurer under the provisions hereof, shall be deemed- Penalty for false certificate.

ed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for the first offense, and Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for the second or other offense, or be imprisoned for a period of six months for the first offense or both such fine and imprisonment, in the direction of the Court.

Appropriation.

Section 5. There is hereby appropriated, out of monies in the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act during the biennium 1949-1951.

Emergency clause.

Section 6. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall become effective upon its passage and approval.
