

## CHAPTER 83

## AN ACT

[H. B. 61]

Pertaining to the licensing of premises for the sale of intoxicating liquor within 200 feet of a school building or church, and amending subsection (3) of Section 35-4-15 ACLA 1949.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That subsection (3) of Section 35-4-15 ACLA 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

(3) PROXIMITY TO SCHOOL OR CHURCH.

No beverage dispensary license or package liquor store license shall be issued for the sale of any intoxicating liquor in any building within two hundred feet of any school building or church measured by shortest direct line from school or church to any such building. For the purpose of this section, an igloo, aerie, parlor or lodge of an American national fraternal organization seeking a club license shall not be deemed to be within the classification of a dispensary with respect to proximity to a church. An American national fraternal organization as used in this section means only such organizations as function in not less than 36 states of the Union and have not less than 500 local units in said 36 states, and have been in active and continuous existence for 20 years. Provided, however, that a license may be reissued for the sale of intoxicating liquor in any building in which the sale of intoxicating liquor was at the time of the passing of this Act, authorized by law.

Be it further provided, however, that when a license for the sale of intoxicating liquor in any building within two hundred feet of a school house or church is forfeited by reason of a violation of law, no license for the sale of intoxicating liquor on those premises shall thereafter be issued.

## CHAPTER 84

### AN ACT

[H. B. 54]

Pertaining to disposition of receipts from issuance of vehicle operator's licenses; abolishing the separate fund provided for in Section 50-3-7, Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated 1949; repealing Section 50-3-7, Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated 1949; and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. The separate fund composed of fees obtained from issuance of vehicle operator's licenses maintained by the Treasurer under the provisions of Section 50-3-7, Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated 1949, is hereby abolished and all balances now remaining in said fund are hereby transferred to the special fund composed of motor fuel tax receipts, subject to expenditure by the Highway Engineer for roads and other purposes; and all fees hereafter collected for vehicle operator's licenses shall go into said special fund. Transfer of funds.

Section 2. Section 50-3-7, Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated 1949, is hereby repealed. Repeal.
