

Be it further provided, however, that when a license for the sale of intoxicating liquor in any building within two hundred feet of a school house or church is forfeited by reason of a violation of law, no license for the sale of intoxicating liquor on those premises shall thereafter be issued.

CHAPTER 84

AN ACT

[H. B. 54]

Pertaining to disposition of receipts from issuance of vehicle operator's licenses; abolishing the separate fund provided for in Section 50-3-7, Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated 1949; repealing Section 50-3-7, Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated 1949; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The separate fund composed of fees obtained from issuance of vehicle operator's licenses maintained by the Treasurer under the provisions of Section 50-3-7, Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated 1949, is hereby abolished and all balances now remaining in said fund are hereby transferred to the special fund composed of motor fuel tax receipts, subject to expenditure by the Highway Engineer for roads and other purposes; and all fees hereafter collected for vehicle operator's licenses shall go into said special fund. Transfer of funds.

Section 2. Section 50-3-7, Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated 1949, is hereby repealed. Repeal.

Emergency
clause.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 85

AN ACT

[H. B. 105]

Amending Section 40-3-31, Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated, 1949, relating to distribution of certain drugs; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 40-3-31, Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Drugs requiring
prescription.

“Sec. 40-3-31. Written order or prescription required: Exceptions. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, to sell, give away, barter, exchange or distribute amytal, luminal, veronal, barbital, acid diethylbarbituric, or any of their salts, derivatives, or compounds of the foregoing substances, or any preparation or compound containing any of the foregoing substances, or their salts, derivatives or compounds, or any registered, trademarked or copyrighted preparation or compound registered in the United States Patent Office containing more than one grain to the avoirdupois or fluid ounce of the above substances, except upon the written order or prescription of a physician, surgeon, dentist or veterinary surgeon duly licensed
