CHAPMAN; AND MEMBERS OF THE INTERNATIONAL FISHERIES COMMISSION STEWART BATES, G. W. NICKERSON, M. C. JAMES, AND EDWARD W. ALLEN.

WHEREAS, regulatory powers over the Alaska halibut fishery vested in the International Fisheries Commission pursuant to a Convention proclaimed August 4, 1937 between the United States of America and Canada revising earlier Conventions for the preservation of the halibut fishery of the northern Pacific Ocean and Bering Sea, and

WHEREAS, from time to time since 1937 certain amendments have been proposed to broaden the Commission's scope of authority under the Convention, and

WHEREAS, drafts of proposed amendments were transmitted by the Commission to the Department of State in 1946 for study and presentation to the two contracting governments, with a view to their adoption and ratification.

NOW, THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, respectfully urges that immediate attention be given the matter of incorporating said amendments in the Convention aforesaid.

HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 28

TO THE TERRITORIAL BOARD OF EDUCATION AND THE
COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in Nineteenth Regular Session assembled, respectfully submits:

WHEREAS, the town of Kenai, Alaska, presently has a school enrollment of 74 pupils who are attending school in a wholly inadequate and unsafe building; and,

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Education plans to erect a new school building at Kenai during the summer of 1949; and,

WHEREAS, a recent survey shows that there are presently living in the Kenai area 96 children of pre-school age, all of whom will be of school age within the next five years, while only 15 of the 74 pupils presently enrolled are of an age permitting their graduation from said school system within said five year period, thereby showing a potential enrollment totaling 155 pupils within the next five years; and,
