HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 3

TO THE HONORABLE HARRY S. TRUMAN, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES; TO THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES; TO THE HONORABLE J. A. KRUG, SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR; AND TO THE HONORABLE E. L. BARTLETT, DELEGATE FROM ALASKA TO CONGRESS:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in 19th regular session assembled, respectfully represents;

WHEREAS, the housing shortage in the Territory of Alaska has assumed dire proportions, and is impeding the speedy and orderly settlement and growth of the Territory; and,

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States, and the Chief Executive of the Nation, His Excellency, the Honorable Harry S. Truman, have expressed great interest in the need for the development of Alaska's vast natural resources; and,

WHEREAS, there is a vital need for the development and settlement of Alaska in connection with the ever-expanding national defense program in the Territory; and,

WHEREAS, the Honorable E. L. Bartlett, Delegate to the Congress from Alaska, has introduced in the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States, now in session, H. R. No. 2122, being a Bill entitled "To promote the settlement and

development of the public domain in the Territory of Alaska by facilitating the construction of necessary housing therein, and for other purposes"; and,

WHEREAS, the provisions of this Bill would encourage and promote the construction of housing facilities in the Territory, would aid in relieving the sub-standard living conditions under which the citizens of the Territory are now forced to live, and would promote and encourage the development, settlement and growth of Alaska;

NOW, THEREFORE, your memorialist respectfully and earnestly requests the Congress to pass and the President to sign H. R. No. 2122 introduced in the 81st Congress by the Honorable E. L. Bartlett, Delegate to Congress from Alaska;

HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 4

TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR, THE SECRETARY OF WAR, THE SECRETARY OF STATE, THE DELEGATE FROM ALASKA, AND THE ALASKA ROAD COMMISSION:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in Nineteenth Session assembled, respectfully submits that:

WHEREAS, the Haines Road, or Cut-off, with its seacoast terminus at Haines, Alaska, and connecting with the Alaska Highway at a point 150 miles from Haines, promises to become an important artery of traffic for tourists and for commercial purposes and should be developed as a year-around route; and,
