NOW, THEREFORE, your memorialist respectfully and earnestly requests the Congress to pass and the President to sign H. R. No. 2122 introduced in the 81st Congress by the Honorable E. L. Bartlett, Delegate to Congress from Alaska;

HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 4

TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR, THE SECRETARY OF WAR, THE SECRETARY OF STATE, THE DELEGATE FROM ALASKA, AND THE ALASKA ROAD COMMISSION:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in Nineteenth Session assembled, respectfully submits that:

WHEREAS, the Haines Road, or Cut-off, with its seacoast terminus at Haines, Alaska, and connecting with the Alaska Highway at a point 150 miles from Haines, promises to become an important artery of traffic for tourists and for commercial purposes and should be developed as a year-around route; and,

WHEREAS, the junction of said Cut-off with the Alaska Highway is only a few miles from the boundary between Alaska and Canada on that portion of the Alaska Highway which leads to Fairbanks, Alaska; and,

WHEREAS, a year-around artery of traffic from Haines along said road would serve to bring about settlement and development of an area in the Territory which is rich in resources and potentialities for business development; but,

WHEREAS, that portion of the Haines Cut-off and segment of the Alaska Highway which is within Canada requires arrangements with the government of Canada to carry out the purpose hereof;

NOW THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the Alaska Legislature, respectfully urges that appropriate steps be taken to secure arrangements with the Canadian government and to bring about measures by and between interested agencies of the United States Government appropriate and adequate to keep said Haines Road open the year-around.

HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 10

TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OF THE UNITED STATES, AND THE DELEGATE FROM ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in Nineteenth Regular Session assembled, respectfully submits:

WHEREAS, there is only one United States District Judge for the Third Judicial Division, Territory of Alaska; and,
