

House Joint Resolutions

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS, the provisions of Section 11-1-4 Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated 1949, give citizens of the United States the exclusive right of employment by the Territory of Alaska, by prohibiting compensation to non-citizens; but,

WHEREAS, there is a shortage of persons in Juneau with the qualifications of stenographers to meet the need of the Legislature for stenographic help during the present winter; and,

WHEREAS, resort has already been had to the services of Mrs. Eleanor Hinke, a competent stenographer, who is a citizen of Canada, and who has applied for United States citizenship, and who should, under the circumstances, be compensated for her work,

BE IT RESOLVED that the provisions of Section 11-1-4 Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated 1949, are hereby suspended with respect to legislative employees for the duration of this special session and the regular session immediately following, which suspension and waiver is to be retroactive to the time when Eleanor Hinke commenced the rendition of services for this Legislature.

An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its final passage.
