NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialist, The House of Representatives of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, prays that the Secretary of the Interior direct the Fish and Wildlife Service to conform to the provisions of the Federal Administrative Procedure Act to the end that the people of Alaska might have "their day in court"; and if an amendment to the said Act be necessary, that an order be issued that during the interim of such enactment by Congress the said Service conform to the practice outlined in the said Act.

### HOUSE MEMORIAL NO. 14

TO THE HIGHWAY ENGINEER AND THE TERRITORIAL BOARD OF ROAD COMMISSIONERS:

Your memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, in Nineteenth Session assembled, respectfully submits:

WHEREAS, the facilities of the Juneau small boat harbor are already overtaxed, and there is an immediate need for additional small boat harbor facilities in Gastineau Channel; and

WHEREAS, the town of Douglas has, with limited financial means, initiated the construction of a small boat harbor at Douglas; and

WHEREAS, a recent survey shows that 124 registered boats would utilize the Douglas small boat harbor immediately upon its improvement to permit accommodation of the same; and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Mines has launched a construction program on Juneau Island adjoining the Douglas small boat harbor

and plans to spend approximately \$500,000.00 on this program, which will include a number of small boats that will need mooring space; and

WHEREAS, the Douglas small boat harbor is in need of extensive improvements far beyond the financial ability of the town of Douglas to provide;

NOW THEREFORE, your memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, in Nineteenth Session assembled, respectfully urges that the Highway Engineer take steps as soon as possible to aid in the general improvement of the small boat harbor at Douglas.

## HOUSE MEMORIAL NO. 15

TO THE HIGHWAY ENGINEER AND THE TERRITORIAL BOARD OF ROAD COMMISSIONERS:

Your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, in the Nineteenth regular session assembled, respectfully represents that:

WHEREAS, the use of aircraft in the Kuskokwim River area is an important part of the economical life of that portion of the country; and,

WHEREAS, at Crooked Creek, on the Kuskokwim River, there are now two short airstrips that could be connected so as to make a suitable airstrip for use of large aircraft;

NOW THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, in Nineteenth regular session assembled, respectfully petitions and prays that the Highway En-
