

## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 3

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS, Alaska is peculiarly dependent because of territorial status upon the good offices and friendship of voting members of Congress; and,

WHEREAS, work performed by such members in behalf of Alaska is necessarily superimposed upon already arduous duties, and truly reflects genuine interest in the development of the Territory; and,

WHEREAS, maritime transportation is one of the most important and complex issues in Alaska's economic life; and,

WHEREAS, Honorable Henry M. Jackson, Member of Congress from the Second District of the State of Washington, now is and for the past three years has been of inestimable service in seeking a solution to Alaska's shipping difficulties; and,

WHEREAS, because of his seniority in the Congress of the United States, coupled with his knowledge of the shipping problem and friendship for Alaska, his cooperation and assistance has been of great help to the Territory; and,

WHEREAS, Congressman Jackson's continued interest promises statesmanlike action by the Federal Government toward a permanent solution adequate to meet Alaska's shipping needs;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Nineteenth Territorial Legislature in regular session assembled that a vote of thanks be, and is hereby extended by this assembly in behalf of the people of Alaska to Congressman Jackson.
