

LAWS OF ALASKA

CHAPTER 1

AN ACT

[C. S. H. B. 5]

Authorizing the Attorney General to transfer the sum of \$2,000.00 available in his biennial appropriations from an item containing a surplus to items where there is a deficiency; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The Attorney General is hereby authorized and empowered to transfer the sum of \$2,000.00 available from the 1949-1951 appropriation for the Office of Attorney General for "Compensation for Special and Associate Counsel in Rate Cases and Other Cases and Hearings and Other Expenses in Such Matters" for the following purposes:

Fund transfer Authority.

To cover deficiency in appropriation for	
Salary of Attorney General as set by Ch. 122	
S.L.A. 1949	\$2,000.00

Section 2. No transfer of funds, as above authorized, will be effective for vouchering purposes unless and until

the office of the Auditor has been officially notified thereof in writing.

Emergency
clause.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall be effective immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 2

AN ACT

[S. B. 61]

To amend Sec. 65-4-13 ACLA 1949 pertaining to punishment upon conviction of rape.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Sec. 65-4-13 ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 65-4-13. That any person over nineteen years of age convicted of rape upon his daughter, or sister, or a female person under twelve years of age, shall be imprisoned in the penitentiary during life; and any person less than nineteen years of age convicted of rape upon his daughter, or sister, or a female person under sixteen years of age, shall be imprisoned in the penitentiary not more than twenty years nor less than three years. Any person convicted of rape upon any other female person shall be imprisoned in the penitentiary not more than twenty years nor less than three years.
