

Fisherman
defined.

Section 8. As used in this Act, "fisherman" shall be defined as any person who is licensed by the Territory to engage in commercial fishing and who at the time injury is sustained or illness contracted is actually so engaged, or occupied in Alaska in preparing or dismantling boats or gear used in such fishing; Provided, that such commercial fishermen as are within the jurisdiction of the Alaska Workmen's Compensation Act by reason of an employer-employee relationship, or otherwise, or are eligible for and able to obtain benefits under any Federal act applicable in their respective cases shall not be eligible for benefits under this Act.

Appropriation.

Section 9. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of \$5,000.00 to be covered into the Fishermen's Fund for organizational purposes, but with the condition that said amount be returned to the General Fund of the Territory within one year.

Severability
clause.

Section 10. If any provision of this Act, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Act and such application to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

CHAPTER 101

AN ACT

[S. J. C. S. H. B. 14]

To adopt as the Code of Alaska, the compilation of Laws authorized in Ch. 28 Session Laws of Alaska 1947; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Exclusive of the indexes, citations to Session Laws, collateral references, annotations, notes and decisions, the compilation of laws of Alaska which was authorized under Chapter 28, Session Laws of Alaska, 1947, and prepared under the direction of the Alaska Law Compilation Commission and published by Bancroft-Whitney Company and entitled Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated, 1949, as set forth in the consecutively numbered sections thereof, is hereby adopted as the Code of Alaska, and said sections as therein published are hereby enacted as laws of the Territory of Alaska; except that the same are hereby amended, repealed and supplemented in accordance with the provisions of the laws enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska in its regular Nineteenth Session of 1949 and the laws heretofore enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska in its Twentieth Session.

Section 2. The Laws of Alaska enacted by the Territorial Legislature prior to the convening of the regular session of the Nineteenth Legislature on January 24, 1949, are hereby repealed.

Repeals.

Section 3. Said compilation entitled "Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated 1949" may be generally referred to as "Alaska Code," but by way of a short form in citing specific sections, the abbreviation "(Sec. No.) ACLA 1949" shall be used.

Short title.

Section 4. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
