CHAPTER 107

AN ACT

[H. B. 64]

To advertise Alaska's tourist attractions and otherwise promote the tourist industry in the Territory, providing for Territorial support thereof, making an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Purpose.

Section 1. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE. Recognizing that the tourist industry is one which if properly promoted can become a major source of revenue for the Territory of Alaska and its people, it is hereby declared to be the purpose of the Territorial government to encourage the development of a greater tourist industry for Alaska through public support of an advertising and promotional campaign to attract visitors to the Territory.

Limitation on expenditure of Territorial moneys.

Section 2. Territorial moneys in the amounts herein and hereafter appropriated shall be expended exclusively for display advertising space in magazines and newspapers of the United States and/or Canada in publicizing the Territory of Alaska for the purpose of promoting Alaska's tourist attractions. Such advertising shall be produced and distributed by or under the direction of the Alaska Visitors Association, incorporated under the laws of the Territory of Alaska for the purpose of promoting Alaska's tourist industry. Territorial moneys shall be issued to said Alaska Visitors Association by warrants

of the Auditor of Alaska in amounts not exceeding the amounts then contributed to and received by the said Association from members thereof for expenditure in accomplishing the purposes for which the corporation was organized; the Auditor of Alaska shall further audit the expenditure of such funds and ascertain that they have been properly expended. The President or other authorized representative of the Alaska Visitors Association shall certify on each claim for payment of Territorial moneys under this authority that the total of Territorial moneys expended up to that time and including that for which claim is made does not exceed the total cash receipts of the Alaska Visitors Association, from other sources. Provided: That no Territorial moneys issued hereunder shall be used to pay the salaries, overhead or other expenses of the Alaska Visitors Association, but shall go exclusively for the purchase of advertising space as provided above.

Section 3. The officer of the Alaska Visitors Association, designated by said Association, for certifying for, ^{Bond.} receiving and expending Territorial moneys shall furnish a good and sufficient bond, in a sum not less than one-third of the Territorial appropriation made each biennium to carry out the provisions of this Act, running to the Territory of Alaska conditioned upon the faithful performance of his duties relating to the expenditure of Territorial moneys, which bond shall be filed with the Auditor of Alaska.

Section 4. The Alaska Visitors Association shall submit to the Legislature at the end of each biennium a ^{Accounting to legislature.} detailed account of all expenditures under this Act.

Section 5. The sum of \$40,000.00 or so much thereof ^{Appropriation.} as shall be found necessary is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the Treasury of the Territory of Alaska not otherwise appropriated to carry out the pro-

visions of this Act in the period beginning from the date of the passage and approval of this Act and ending March 31, 1953.

CHAPTER 108

AN ACT

[H. B. 81]

To pay the Travelers Insurance Company \$9,173.38, excess payment made on their premium tax during the years 1946 to 1949, as shown on their tax statement for the year 1949.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of the General Fund of the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of Nine Thousand One Hundred Seventy Three Dollars and Thirty-eight Cents (\$9,173.38) to pay the Travelers Insurance Company for excess payments made to the Territory of Alaska during the years 1946 to 1949, as shown on their 1949 tax statement, under premiums received on war contracts in connection with the Comprehensive Rating Plan.
