

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The Department of Public Welfare is hereby authorized, upon duly presented vouchers properly approved, to reimburse certain hospitals in Alaska for services rendered to indigents, in accordance with the following schedule:

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Eighteen Thousand Eight Hundred Eighty-four Dollars and Twenty-five Cents (\$18,884.25) out of the monies in the Treasury of the Territory of Alaska not otherwise appropriated, to be expended for the above purpose by the Department of Public Welfare. Appropriation.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval. Emergency clause.

CHAPTER 120

AN ACT

[S. B. 92]

Amending Sec. 37-2-21 ACLA 1949 pertaining to the qualifications of Commissioner of Education; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 37-2-21 ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Qualifications.

Section 37-2-21. QUALIFICATIONS. No person shall be qualified for the office of Commissioner of Education who is not a citizen of the United States. The Commissioner shall be chosen upon merit, according to qualifications prescribed by the Board of Education, and because of his special fitness to propose and execute beneficial educational policies for the general supervision, government and control of the public schools of the Territory.

Emergency clause

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 121

AN ACT

[H. B. 43]

To authorize and empower civilian defense officers, members and personnel to act as police officers and to make arrests in the performance of their civilian defense duties, and to discharge them from all liability for damages howsoever incurred or by whomsoever or whatsoever suffered for all acts, except willful misconduct, in the performance of civilian defense duties; and making violations of civilian defense rules and regulations a misdemeanor and prescribing penalties for such violations; and declaring an emergency and termination date.
