

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 37-2-21 ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Qualifications.

Section 37-2-21. QUALIFICATIONS. No person shall be qualified for the office of Commissioner of Education who is not a citizen of the United States. The Commissioner shall be chosen upon merit, according to qualifications prescribed by the Board of Education, and because of his special fitness to propose and execute beneficial educational policies for the general supervision, government and control of the public schools of the Territory.

Emergency clause

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 121

AN ACT

[H. B. 43]

To authorize and empower civilian defense officers, members and personnel to act as police officers and to make arrests in the performance of their civilian defense duties, and to discharge them from all liability for damages howsoever incurred or by whomsoever or whatsoever suffered for all acts, except willful misconduct, in the performance of civilian defense duties; and making violations of civilian defense rules and regulations a misdemeanor and prescribing penalties for such violations; and declaring an emergency and termination date.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. A national and territorial emergency exists requiring the creation, maintenance and operation in Alaska of civilian defense activities by loyal, patriotic, civilian citizens.

Section 2. All officers, members and personnel of all territorial, municipal and other civilian defense councils and organizations in Alaska are hereby authorized and empowered to act as police officers and to make arrests in the performance of their civilian defense duties. Police powers authorized.

Section 3. Any person arrested for any such violation shall be taken, as soon as the then emergency ends, before the nearest United States Commissioner or municipal magistrate within whose precinct or municipality the violation was committed, and shall be charged by written complaint with the violation of the law or ordinance whereof he is accused. All such violations are hereby declared a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, the violator thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or by imprisonment in jail for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, for each such offense. United States Commissioners and City Magistrates are hereby granted jurisdiction to hear and try persons accused of such violations and, upon conviction, to punish them in accordance herewith. Penalties.

Section 4. No officer, member, or personnel of any territorial, municipal or other civilian defense council or organization in Alaska shall be held liable for damages howsoever incurred or by whomsoever or whatsoever suffered for any act of commission or omission done by him, except for willful misconduct, in the performance of his civilian defense duties. Immunity from damage suit

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act shall be effective immediately upon its passage and approval. This Act shall terminate upon declaration by the Governor of Alaska that an emergency no longer exists.

CHAPTER 122

AN ACT

[H. B. 82]

Relating to bounties on Hair Seals; amending Sec. 33-3-131 and Sec. 33-3-132 ACLA 1949, as amended by Ch. 16 S.L.A. 1949; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Sec. 33-3-131 ACLA 1949, as amended by Ch. 16 S.L.A. 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 33-3-131. BOUNTY ON HAIR SEAL DECLARED. There is hereby placed on every hair seal inhabiting the inland waters and all waters adjacent to the southern coast of Alaska east of the 152nd Meridian, and the waters of Bristol Bay and the coastal waters within three miles off the Mainland from Stebbins to Cape Krusenstern, inclusive, a bounty of \$3.00, such sum to be paid in accordance with the provisions following.
