CHAPTER 122

AN ACT

[H. B. 82]

Relating to bounties on Hair Seals; amending Sec. 33-3-131 and Sec. 33-3-132 ACLA 1949, as amended by Ch. 16 S.L.A. 1949; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Sec. 33-3-131 ACLA 1949, as amended by Ch. 16 S.L.A. 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 33-3-131. BOUNTY ON HAIR SEAL DECLARED. There is hereby placed on every hair seal inhabiting the inland waters and all waters adjacent to the southern coast of Alaska east of the 152nd Meridian, and the waters of Bristol Bay and the coastal waters within three miles off the Mainland from Stebbins to Cape Krusenstern, inclusive, a bounty of \$3.00, such sum to be paid in accordance with the provisions following.

Section 2. That Sec. 33-3-132 ACLA 1949, as amended by Ch. 16 S.L.A. 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 33-3-132. CLAIM OF BOUNTY: ACCOMPANYING EXHIBITS: CERTIFICATE OF CLAIMANT. To obtain said bounty, any person killing a hair seal within the limits herein prescribed, in Alaska, after the passage of this Act (Secs. 33-3-131—33-3-134 herein), shall, as soon as possible exhibit, to any United States Commissioner, United States Postmaster, United States Assistant Postmaster or Notary Public within the Territory of Alaska, so much of the skin (or scalp), taken from the head of said hair seal, intact, as to show the whole face, including both eyeholes and both ears, and shall subscribe to a certificate in substantially the following form:

Certification required.

I, _____, of _____, Alaska, hereby certify that on the _____ day of _____, 19____, I killed _____ hair seals and took from their heads the scalps herewith exhibited, in the vicinity of _____, Territory of Alaska; that no poison or other means was employed that might cause the wanton destruction of other animals or birds; that I am justly entitled to the bounty of Three Dollars (\$3.00) for each hair seal scalp exhibited, under the laws of Alaska.  the person actually taking such hair seal and
 subscribing to the foregoing certificates. No
 intermediary or other person, partnership, or
 corporation, other than the person actually tak-
 ing such hair seal, shall be entitled to any pay-
 ment of bounty hereunder.
