Section 12. TITLE OF ACT. This act shall be known as the "Alaska Motor Vehicle Act."

Section 14. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 1952.

## CHAPTER 125

### AN ACT

[S. B. 106]

To amend Chapter 95, S.L.A. 1951, Section 3 (a) (4), to provide for the coverage of certain officers and employees of Territorial and local governments under the old-age and survivors insurance provisions of title II of the Federal Social Security Act, as amended; and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. Section 3 (a) (4) of Chapter 95, S.L.A. 1951, is amended to read as follows:

(4) All services which constitute employment as defined in Section 2 and are performed

in the employ of the Territory by employees of the Territory shall be covered by the agreement; and,

Section 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. An emergency <sup>Emergency clause.</sup> is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall be effective immediately upon its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 126

### AN ACT

[S. B. 60]

Relating to providing Aid to the Blind; establishing eligibility factors and amount of assistance; providing penalties; and fixing an effective date.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. DEFINITIONS. As used in this Act:

Definitions

(a) "Welfare Department" means the Department of Public Welfare created by Chapter 3, Extraordinary Session Laws 1937 (51-1-1—51-1-5 ACLA 1949).

(b) "Needy blind resident" means any needy blind <sup>Needy blind resident.</sup> person 18 years of age or over, who has resided in the Territory for five (5) out of the last nine (9) years immediately preceding application for assistance, or who has lost his or her vision while a resident of the Territory.

(c) "A blind person" is one who has no vision or <sup>Blind person</sup> whose vision is so defective as to prevent the perform-
