CHAPTER 51

AN ACT

[H. B. 127]

To amend Section 37-3-32 ACLA 1949 pertaining to the number of school board members in a city school district, and establishing an effective date.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 37-3-32 ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 37-3-32. City as school district: Buildings and funds: School Board. Every city shall constitute a school district, and it shall be the duty of the council to provide the same with suitable school houses, and to provide the necessary funds to maintain public schools therein, but such schools when established shall be under the supervision and control of a school board of five members. The members of such board

first elected shall hold their office for one, two, three, four, and five years, respectively, and until their successors are elected and qualified, and one member of said board shall be elected each year thereafter for a term of five years and until his successor is elected and qualified. Provided, municipalities already organized and operating under the provisions of Section 37-3-32 ACLA 1949 shall at the next annual school board election after the passage and approval of this act elect as many school board members as is necessary to complete the full membership of five (5) and immediately after qualifying the three (3) newly elected members shall determine by lot which member shall serve for a three year term, which for a four year term and which for a five year term. The term of office of the holdover members of the old 3-member board shall remain unchanged. Members of the school board shall each, before entering upon the duties of their office, take an oath in writing to honestly and faithfully discharge the duties of their trust. Within seven days after each annual election the board shall organize and shall annually elect one of their members president, one treasurer, and one clerk of the board. In case a vacancy in membership of said board occurs from death, resignation, removal or other cause, such vacancy may be filled by appointment by the council of the city with the consent of the remaining members of the board, and in the event the remaining members of the board do not consent to have the vacancy filled by the council, such vacancy shall be filled by special election upon at least ten days notice called by the council. When a vacancy is filled by appointment by the city

council the appointee shall serve only until a successor is elected at the next general election.

Section 2. This act shall become effective April 1, ^{Effective} 1951. _{date.}

CHAPTER 52

AN ACT

[H. B. 136]

To amend Section 61-16-4 ACLA 1949, relating to Final Accounts in the administration of decedents' estates.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 61-16-4 ACLA, 1949 is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

No Final Order or Decree shall be made or entered in the administration of any estate in which the Territory is interested, either as a creditor or by way of escheat, unless it shall be made to appear to the satisfaction of the Court that certified copies of the Final Account and the notice of hearing thereon have been forwarded to the Territorial Treasurer. ^{Notice to Treasurer.}
