

## CHAPTER 53

## AN ACT

[H. B. 155]

Pertaining to tax on punchboards; defining offenses and prescribing penalties; amending Chapter 116, Session Laws of Alaska, 1949

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. Chapter 116, Session Laws of Alaska, 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. Every distributor who distributes in the Territory of Alaska a punchboard, will pay the following license before the same is sold to the retail trade:

(a) \$2.00 per each board of 2,000 holes, or less.

(b) \$4.00 per each 1,000 holes or fraction thereof, in each board having an excess of 2,000 holes.

Section 2. Such tax shall be paid by purchasing stamps from the office of the Tax Commissioner. Said stamps shall be affixed to the punchboard prior to its being placed in use, and the operator thereof shall endorse upon said stamp the serial number of the punchboard.

Section 3. The Tax Commissioner shall have the power to issue all orders, rules and regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act.

Section 4. This Act shall not be construed in any way to legalize gambling.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful and a violation of this act (a) for any person, firm or corporation to distribute in the Territory of Alaska any punchboard for which

the license tax herein provided has not been paid; and (b) for any person, firm or corporation to maintain for use, or permit the use of, in any place or premises occupied by such person, firm or corporation, any such punchboard upon which such license stamp has not been affixed. Any person, firm, or corporation violating any provision of this Act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

Section 6. 75% of the tax on punchboards collected from sales thereof within incorporated cities shall be refunded to such cities and the balance shall be deposited in the general fund of the Territory of Alaska.
