

CHAPTER 58

AN ACT

[S. B. 74]

To extend the opportunity for higher education to the maximum possibilities in the Territory of Alaska.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Policy.

Section 1. POLICY. To expand educational and cultural opportunities in Alaska to keep pace with the Territory's expansion in other fields and to provide educational facilities of particular interest to resident Alaskans.

Expansion.

Section 2. EXPANSION AUTHORIZED. The Board of Regents of the University of Alaska is hereby authorized and directed to expand the University of Alaska as hereinafter indicated as to all of its functions and services.

Survey authorized.

Section 3. The Board of Regents of the University of Alaska is hereby authorized to make a study of the principles and applicability to Alaska of the Junior College; to establish additional extension courses and such other expansion of accredited courses for students as may seem advisable; providing facilities suitable for carrying out a University program; employment of personnel; procurement of supplies and the taking of all other appropriate measures to carry out the intent and purpose hereof.

Extension of prior laws to program.

Section 4. EXTENSION OF COMPLIANCE ACTS. All laws of Alaska designed to meet requirements of the United States Government for the Territory's acceptance of Federal grants and allotments for educational and/or kindred purposes are hereby extended to cover the establishment and operation of the University Expansion Program as above outlined.

Section 5. ENDOWMENTS OR DONATIONS. All monetary gifts, bequests or endowments, as distinguished from Territorial appropriations and Federal allotments. received for the University Expansion Program or other use shall be turned over to the Territorial Treasurer, who is hereby designated as the officer to whom such monies shall be paid, and he is hereby directed to deposit same in the separate fund established and maintained under Section 37-10-14 ACLA 1949. As to land or personal property, other than money, devised, bequeathed or otherwise donated in the premises, title and control or possession of same shall be taken by the University in its corporate capacity acting by and through the Regents or other authorized agents or agent, and said property shall be entered on the perpetual inventory of the University.

Amending Sec. 16-1-63 ACLA 1949 pertaining to signature of warrants by the municipal clerk and others.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Sec. 16-1-63 ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 16-1-63. Municipal Clerk. The Municipal Clerk shall attend the meetings of the council, keep a full record
