

TERM: VACANCIES: COMPENSATION AND EXPENSES. There is hereby created the Alaska Development Board, whose duty it shall be to carry out the purposes and provisions of this Act. The members of the Board shall consist of five persons, consisting of one from each judicial division and one at large, who shall be bona fide residents of Alaska, to be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature. The Board shall elect one of its members as Chairman. Each member shall hold office for a term of four years commencing on April 1st of the year in which he is appointed and until his successor is appointed and duly qualified. The Governor shall have the power to fill vacancies in the membership of the Board for the balance of the unexpired term. The members of the Board shall serve without pay under this Act, except that each member may be reimbursed for actual and necessary traveling and subsistence expense incurred in connection with the performance of his duties under this Act.

## CHAPTER 6

### AN ACT

[H. B. 56]

To amend Section 6 of Chapter 66, Session Laws of Alaska 1949, pertaining to the licensing of fishermen; and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Section 6 of Chapter 66, Session Laws of Alaska, 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Authority  
to arrest.

Section 6. (a) For the purpose of enforcing this Act, the Tax Commissioner's deputies are hereby made peace officers with authority to make arrests (with or without warrants) for a violation of any of the provisions of this Act. Likewise, the agents of the Fish and Wildlife Service, Department of the Interior, are hereby fully authorized to enforce this Act. (b) Licenses shall be subject to inspection, and shall, upon request by any officer authorized to enforce this Act, be exhibited to him. Failure to procure or exhibit such license as indicated above or otherwise comply with this Act shall be a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof the offender shall be subject to a fine not exceeding \$500.00 or imprisonment not to exceed six months, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
