

CHAPTER 71

AN ACT

[S. B. 65]

Providing for the destruction of obsolete records and papers; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. At the end of each fiscal year the head of any territorial department with the approval of the Attorney General, may destroy all vouchers, documents and other records and papers on file that have been kept in his office for a period of more than ten years which, in his opinion and the opinion of the Attorney General are no longer of use or value, and the Attorney General may do so with the approval of the Treasurer; Provided, however, that no vouchers, or other records of value in the opinion of the Attorney General, shall be destroyed before they have been microfilmed; and provided, further, that all such microfilms of territorial records shall be permanently preserved. This shall not apply to records which are considered to be of permanent value.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be effective immediately upon its passage and approval.
