

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. The sum of \$352.36 is hereby appropriated out of monies in the Treasury of the Territory of Alaska not otherwise appropriated, to compensate Charles E. Boyer for interest paid by him on money that he was obliged to borrow in order to pay for materials he used in constructing the school at Clark's Point, Alaska, which money was borrowed because of the failure of the Territory to make such payment when the same became due. Appropriation.

Section 2. Payment under this appropriation shall be made upon a voucher approved by the Commissioner of Education for the Territory of Alaska. Payment by voucher.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval. Emergency clause.

## CHAPTER 86

### AN ACT

[H. B. 92]

Amending Section 26 of Chapter 119 SLA 1949 relating to vital statistics.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Section 26 of Chapter 119 SLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 26. COMMISSIONER TO RECORD  
AND TRANSMIT CERTIFICATES: FEES.

It shall be the duty of every United States Commissioner within Alaska to record every birth, death and marriage certificate presented to him for record; and said United States Commissioner shall receive as compensation for his services in recording each of said certificates the fees prescribed by the Attorney General of the United States for similar services performed by United States Commissioners acting as ex-officio recorders. The United States Commissioners of each recording district shall on or before the tenth day of each month transmit to the Registrar of Vital Statistics all original certificates of birth, death and marriage filed with him for the preceding calendar month; and he shall at the same time submit to the Registrar an account of fees due for recording certificates of birth and death during the preceding calendar month, which account shall be audited by the Registrar, and if approved by him, shall be paid from the funds of Alaska. For each certificate of birth, death or stillbirth occurring within Alaska, and not previously recorded, properly completed, signed, and filed with the United States Commissioner within a time limit prescribed by the Registrar, the person signing and filing such certificate shall be entitled to a fee of one dollar (\$1.00), upon presentation to the Registrar of a statement therefor, duly verified by the U. S. Commissioner with whom such certificate was filed. This does not apply to such certificates filed by a physician or nurse in the course of his or her duties as prescribed in this Act.
