

tion of that Division, and the apportionment of delegates of the convention is based upon the population which includes the families and dependents of the military personnel; and

WHEREAS, this apportionment contained in the provisions of Sec. 2 of the Bill, may well result in a complete control of the convention by the Third Judicial Division, without regard to the rights of the other judicial divisions; and

WHEREAS, a proper apportionment of the delegates should be made without the inclusion of delegates at large and should be apportioned as follows: First judicial division, eight delegates; second judicial division, three delegates; third judicial division, twelve delegates; and fourth judicial division, eight delegates;

NOW THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the House of Representatives for the Territory of Alaska in Twentieth Session assembled, respectfully urges that S. Bill No. 50 be amended so as to make a fair apportionment of the delegates to the constitutional convention, and to make an apportionment to the respective judicial divisions as hereinabove set forth.

HOUSE MEMORIAL NO. 18

TO THE HONORABLE ERNEST GRUENING, GOVERNOR OF ALASKA; TO THE ALASKA AERONAUTICS AND COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION AND TO THE DIVISION OF AERONAUTICS:

Your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, in Twentieth Session assembled, respectfully represents:

WHEREAS, the Kasilof airplane field is on the direct route of

planes flying on regular daily schedule to and from Anchorage, Homer, Kodiak and Naknek; and

WHEREAS, Kasilof field should be lengthened and improved so as to accommodate DC-3 and similar type planes which would reduce freight rates; and

WHEREAS, Kasilof project is approved in the National Airport plan of the CAA to receive funds under the Federal Airport Act on a 25% to 75% matching basis with Federal funds.

NOW THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, in Twentieth Session assembled, respectfully requests that the Director of the Division of Aeronautics be authorized to make a survey of the Kasilof airplane field at an early date, looking toward such improvements.

Your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, respectfully represents:

WHEREAS, there are no regular or emergency airplane landing facilities at or in the vicinity of St. Michael on Norton Sound, Alaska, and
