### HOUSE MEMORIAL NO. 29

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR; THE SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE; THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE FEDERAL WORKS AGENCY; THE COMMISSIONER OF ROADS FOR ALASKA; THE ALASKA REGIONAL FORESTER; THE COMMISSIONER OF THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS; THE TERRITORIAL HIGHWAY ENGINEER AND THE DELEGATE IN CONGRESS FROM ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, respectfully represents:

WHEREAS, the Katalla-Yakataga region of Alaska is highly mineralized, possesses large known coal deposits and is recognized as especially favorable for the existence of petroleum; and

WHEREAS, no suitable means of transportation exists into this promising region of Alaska; and

WHEREAS, the Katalla-Yakataga region could be reached overland by the construction of a branch road from the Cordova Highway.

NOW THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska in Twentieth Regular Session assembled, respectfully urges that the appropriate agencies include in their budgets and press for the approval by Congress of an appropriation to construct a road from the Cordova Highway to the Katalla-Yakataga region.

### HOUSE MEMORIAL NO. 30

TO THE HONORABLE ERNEST GRUENING, GOVERNOR OF ALASKA; TO THE TERRITORIAL BOARD OF HEALTH; AND TO DR. C. EARL ALBRECHT, COMMISSIONER OF HEALTH:

Your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, in Twentieth Session assembled, respectfully represents:

WHEREAS, Naknek, Alaska is at the present time without an adequate Health Center; and

WHEREAS, Naknek, Alaska is an important community as one of the centers of activity in the Bristol Bay area; and

WHEREAS, Naknek, Alaska is entirely without hospital facilities and without a doctor, the nearest doctor being located at a distance of more than 90 miles without connecting road; and

WHEREAS, the town of Naknek has shown admirable community spirit by securing for themselves a building suitable for a Health Center and have by their own labor, with the help of a tractor loaned from the army, moved said building to a desirable site; and

WHEREAS, further necessary work on said building will have to be done in the summer when no work of a voluntary kind can be expected as this is the only time when people in the district can get work to provide for their winter's requirements; and

WHEREAS, funds will be needed to provide for this work as well as to pay for building materials, a kitchen range, two heating stoves and furnishings for clinic and quarters; and
