HOUSE MEMORIAL NO. 53

TO THE DIRECTOR OF THE BUREAU OF THE BUDGET; THE SENATE AND HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEES OF THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES; THE HONORABLE LESTER C. HUNT; CHAIRMAN OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE ON ALASKA PREPAREDNESS OF THE SENATE ARMED FORCES COMMITTEE; THE HONORABLE CARL VINSON; THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE AND TO THE DELEGATE IN CONGRESS FROM ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, in Twentieth Session assembled, respectfully represents:

WHEREAS, construction work in Alaska is subject to seasonal limitations by reason of climatic factors and other circumstances; and

WHEREAS, various projects essential to the defense of the United States are being contemplated for construction in Alaska in 1951; and

WHEREAS, the funds for many of these projects including classified military installations and housing units for members of the military and their dependents are included in the Third Supplemental Appropriations bill soon to be considered by the Bureau of the Budget and the Appropriations Committee of Congress; and

WHEREAS, it is urgent to fulfill the requirements in the overall defense plan that these structures be completed this year; and

WHEREAS, a start on the actual work, which cannot be made until after the funds are appropriated, must occur within the immediate future if this time schedule is to be met.

NOW THEREFORE, Your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, respectfully urges that early and favorable action be taken on the appropriation of funds for the Alaska projects included in the Third Supplemental Appropriations Act; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be transmitted by radiogram to Delegate Bartlett for distribution to the others to whom it is addressed.

HOUSE MEMORIAL NO. 54

TO THE HONORABLE CHARLES F. BRANNAN, SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE, AND TO THE HONORABLE LYLE F. WATTS, CHIEF FORESTER OF THE UNITED STATES:

Your memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Legislature of Alaska, in Twentieth Regular Session assembled, respectfully represents:

WHEREAS, the laws of the United States and particularly the Act of June 4, 1897 (16 United States Code Annotated, Section 476) prohibits the export of logs from national forests in Alaska except when in the discretion of the Secretary of Agriculture the supply of timber for local use will not be endangered thereby, and the Secretary of Agriculture is given power by law to issue rules and regula-
