

licity material, and designing and production costs in the preparation of such advertising and material for the purpose of promoting, advertising and publicizing Alaska's tourist attractions as provided above.

Bond of certifying officer.

Section 3. The officer of the Alaska Visitors Association, designated by said Association, for certifying for, receiving and expending Territorial moneys shall furnish a good and sufficient bond, in a sum not less than one-third of the Territorial appropriation made each biennium to carry out the provisions of the Act, running to the Territory of Alaska conditioned upon the faithful performance of his duties relating to the expenditure of Territorial moneys, which bond shall be filed with the Auditor of Alaska.

Accounting to Legislature.

Section 4. The Alaska Visitors Association shall submit to the Legislature at the end of each biennium a detailed account of all expenditures under this Act.

Appropriation.

Section 5. The sum of Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00) is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the Treasury of the Territory of Alaska not otherwise appropriated for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Act during the 1953-55 biennium.

CHAPTER 128

AN ACT

[H. B. 81]

Authorizing the Alaska Aeronautics and Communications Commission to give financial aid for aeronautical education and training to eligible veterans, and amending Section 11 of Chapter 123, Session Laws of Alaska 1949.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 11 of Chapter 123, Session Laws of Alaska 1949, is amended by adding thereto sub-section B as follows:

B. The Commission may grant financial aid for aeronautical education or training to persons who receive educational or vocational assistance in the field of aeronautics under Public Law 550, 82nd Congress, upon the following terms and conditions:

Financial aid for aeronautical training.

1. Persons granted aid must have been legal residents of Alaska for at least one year immediately prior to their application for aid, and a resident of Alaska for not less than one year prior to their entry into the service.

Alaskan residence required.

2. The education or training for which the aid is given must be taken in Alaska in a school or program approved by the Commission.

Training in Alaska.

3. The amount of aid granted to any person may not exceed the total amount received by the person as assistance for aeronautical education or training under Public Law 550, 82nd Congress.

Maximum assistance.

4. No aid shall be granted to a person until the assistance to which the person is entitled for aeronautical education or training under Public Law 550, 82nd Congress, has been exhausted by such person.

Federal aid must be exhausted.

5. The aid shall be granted under the same terms and conditions as the assistance under Public Law 550, 82nd Congress.

Terms comparable to Federal.

The Commission may not expend in excess of \$25,000.00 per annum from the Alaska Aero-

Maximum expenditure by Commission.

nautical Revolving Fund to carry out the program of aid provided for by this subsection.

CHAPTER 129

AN ACT

[H. B. 82]

To amend Section 33-2-2 of Chapter 2, ACLA 1949, relating to Agricultural and Industrial Fairs: Exhibits.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 33-2-2 of Chapter 2, ACLA 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 33-2-2 TIME AND PLACE OF HOLDING: AMOUNT AND CONDITIONS OF AID. Fairs may be held each year in each of the four Judicial Divisions of the Territory and the Territorial aid to the conduct and maintenance of such fairs shall not exceed the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) annually for each Division; Provided, that the people of each Division shall subscribe and have available for expenditure an equal amount for such purpose, and shall have, or shall organize, an Agricultural and Industrial Fair Association for the conduct and maintenance of such fairs. Provided, further, that each of said fairs shall be open to entries by the people of the whole Territory and that special provisions shall be made for exhibits from Boys' and Girls' Clubs.
