CHAPTER 78

AN ACT

[C. S. H. B. 85]

Pertaining to the qualifications and requirements for practice of dental hygienists, and amending Section 35-3-51 ACLA 1949.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. WHO MAY BECOME DENTAL HYGIENISTS. Any person of good moral character being eighteen years of age or over and holding or having a diploma of graduation from an accredited high school, and likewise holding and having a diploma or proper certificate of graduation from an American training school for dental hygienists requiring at least a two-year course and accredited and recognized by the Board of Dental Examiners, may, upon written application made to and filed with the secretary of the Board at least thirty days prior to the date selected by the Board for the examination, be examined by such Board for qualification as a dental hygienist. A dental hygienist who is the holder of a certificate from any school accredited by the American Dental Association and who shall have had two years of practical experience shall be qualified to practice in Alaska upon registering with the Alaska Dental Board, without examination.

Reciprocity.

An application for qualification shall be accompanied by the applicant's certificate of graduation as aforesaid, and at the time of filing the same such applicant shall pay to the Board a fee of \$10.00, which fee, together with all other fees or charges in this Act provided shall be covered into the general fund of the Territory of Alaska.

Fee.

Examinations. One examination shall be held each year at the same time as the examination of dentists by the Dental Board. Such examinations shall be conducted in the English language and shall cover subjects considered essential by the Board for a dental hygienist and shall likewise include a practical examination on removal of deposits or stains from the exposed surfaces of the teeth.

Registration. If the applicant, in the opinion of the Board, successfully passes the examination, he or she shall be registered and receive a certificate of ability to practice as a dental hygienist in the Territory. Every registered dental hygienist shall, before entering practice, pay the Dental Board \$10.00 as a registration fee and secure from it an annual license to practice. Before May 1 in each year, every registered dental hygienist desiring to begin or continue to practice in the Territory of Alaska shall pay to the Board a fee of \$10.00 for the annual registration thereof. The failure, neglect, or refusal of any such duly licensed dental hygienist to pay such annual registration fee shall constitute a forfeiture of such license, but such license may be restored upon written application therefor and the payment to the Board of the sum of \$10.00.

Statement of place of employment. It shall be the duty of every dental hygienist in the Territory to furnish the Board with information as to his place of employment and the name of the dentist, dentists or institution by whom he is employed.

Practice under supervision of licensed dentist. No person shall practice dental hygiene, either gratuitously or for pay, nor shall he offer or attempt so to practice nor shall he advertise or announce himself publicly or privately as prepared or qualified so to practice, without having such a license as in this section provided, nor shall any licensed dental hygienist practice except under the supervision of a licensed dentist as in this Act provided.

Section 2. TEMPORARY LICENSE. The Board may issue, without examination, to any person qualified as

aforesaid to be examined a temporary license to practice as a dental hygienist in the employ of the United States of America or the Territory of Alaska or any legally incorporated eleemosynary dispensary or infirmary, private school or welfare center. Such temporary license shall be in force only while such dental hygienist is in the employ of the United States of America or the Territory of Alaska, or legally incorporated eleemosynary dispensary or infirmary, private school or welfare center, and shall automatically be cancelled when such dental hygienist shall have been examined by the Board, and shall be subject to revocation by the Board at any time.

Section 3. EMPLOYMENT OF AND PRACTICE BY DENTAL HYGIENISTS. Any licensed dentist, legally incorporated eleemosynary dental dispensary or infirmary, private school or welfare center, the United States of America or the Territory of Alaska may employ licensed dental hygienists. A dental hygienist may clean teeth, performing only such operations on the teeth as are cleansing, and may use such mouth washes as are approved by the Board of Dental Examiners, but shall not perform any repair work or the preparation thereof, or any other operation on the teeth or tissues of the mouth. He may operate in the office of any licensed dentist, or legally incorporated eleemosynary dental dispensary or infirmary, private school or welfare center, or in any building owned or occupied by the Territory, but only under the aforesaid employment and under the direct or general supervision of a licensed dentist.

Section 4. REVOCATION OF DENTIST'S LICENSE. The Board of Dental Examiners may revoke the license of any dentist who shall permit any dental hygienist employed by or working under his supervision to perform any dental operation other than that permitted under the provisions of this Act; provided, before any license shall be revoked, the holder thereof shall be notified in writing of the grounds for revocation and shall

Notice required. be given an opportunity to present evidence and be heard by the Board.

Penalties. Section 5. VIOLATING PROVISIONS, PENALTY. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Act or who shall fail to comply with any of the requirements or provisions of this Act, penalty for which is not otherwise provided, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars.

Suspension or revocation of hygienists's license. Section 6. SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF LICENSE. The Board of Dental Examiners may, upon hearing and ten days notice, suspend or revoke, with power to reinstate, the license of any licensed dental hygienist who, in its opinion, has violated any of the provisions of this Act or who, in its opinion, is guilty of professional misbehavior, or is not of good moral character.

Section 7. Section 35-3-51 ACLA 1949 is amended to read as follows:

Practice of dentistry defined. Section 35-3-51. PRACTICE OF DENTISTRY DEFINED: PRESUMPTIONS AS TO PRACTICE. Excepting persons duly licensed to practice medicine and surgery in the Territory of Alaska, and dental hygienists duly registered and licensed in Alaska who may practice their profession as defined by law, any person shall be considered as practicing dentistry within the meaning of this Act who shall for salary, for fee, money or other compensation, paid to either himself, an employer or any other person, directly or indirectly perform or make any operation or treatment of the human tooth or teeth, jaw or jaws, or of any disease or lesion of the human tooth or teeth, jaw or jaws, or the malposition thereof, or do any drilling or filling,

remove tartar from, clean or extract teeth or tooth, of any person.

Any persons who shall append the letters "D. D. S.", "D. M. D." or word "Dentist" to his name in any way for advertising, or upon any door or sign, shall be presumed to practice dentistry and as such be subject to the provisions of this Act.

CHAPTER 79

AN ACT

[H. B. 73]

Relating to the sale of Intoxicating Liquors; and, amending Section 35-4-32, as amended by Chapter 70, Session Laws of Alaska 1951.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Sec. 35-4-32 ACLA 1949 as amended by Chapter 70, Session Laws of Alaska 1951, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 35-4-32. MONTHLY STATEMENT AS TO LIQUOR SOLD: QUARTERLY PAYMENTS: PENALTY AND INTEREST. Each such brewer, distiller, bottler, jobber, wholesaler, manufacturer or other consignor shall on the first day of each calendar month mail, postage prepaid, to the Territorial Tax Commissioner at Juneau, Alaska, a statement containing a true account of the total number of gallons, including fractional gallons, together with the respective names and Alaskan addresses of, and itemized as to the respective gallonage of each such kind of liquor sold to, or consigned to, the respective buyers or consignees thereof which such brewer,
