(b) One of the members of the Commission so appointed shall be chosen by all members as Chairman of the Commission. Members of the Commission shall be reimbursed for actual travel expenses and shall receive a per diem allowance for each day that they are away from home in connection with their official duties in carrying out the purpose of this Act. The reimbursement of all Commissioners shall be from the Employment Security Commission administration fund.

(c) Any three Commissioners shall constitute a quorum, and no vacancy shall impair the rights of the remaining Commissioners to exercise all the powers of the Commission.

CHAPTER 84

AN ACT

[S. H. B. 75]

Repealing Section 35-3-42 and creating an Alaska Dental Examiners Board; amending Sections 35-3-47 and 35-3-52; and establishing an effective date.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Repeal.

Section 1. Section 35-3-42, ACLA 1949, is hereby repealed and the Board of Dental Examiners created thereunder is hereby abolished. Said Board of Dental Examiners herein abolished shall deliver to the Alaska Dental Examiners Board, all such property, books, papers, records and unexpended funds pertaining to the business of said Board as are now in their possession and under their control.

Section 2. ALASKA DENTAL EXAMINERS BOARD: MEMBERS, THEIR QUALIFICATIONS, APPOINTMENT AND TERMS: VACANCIES AND OATH OF

OFFICE. A Dental Examiners Board for the Territory of Alaska is hereby created. Such Board shall consist of five members who shall be appointed by the Governor, for a term of five years, upon recommendation by the Alaska Dental Society, subject to confirmation by a majority of both houses of the Legislature in joint session assembled. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment for the unexpired term, by the Governor, subject to confirmation at the next Session of the Legislature. Initially, one member shall be appointed for a term of one year, one member for a term of two years, one member for three years, one member for four years, and one for a term of five years. Thereafter, all appointments or reappointments shall be for a full term of five years. No more than two members of the Board shall be graduates of the same school of dentistry. Members shall serve until their successors are duly appointed. No one shall be qualified to serve as a member of the Board unless he is a registered voter of the Territory and duly registered as a dentist therein. Before entering upon duty each member of the Board shall file with the Governor his oath of office to the effect that he will faithfully and impartially discharge his duties as a member of the Alaska Dental Examiners Board.

Section 3. The Alaska Dental Examiners Board shall have all the powers, duties and functions formerly had and performed by the Board of Dental Examiners as provided in Sections 35-3-41 through 35-3-55 ACLA 1949, inclusive, and wherever the words "Board of Dental Examiners" occur therein the words "Alaska Dental Examiners Board" shall be substituted therefor.

Section 4. Section 35-3-47 ACLA 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 35-3-47. Examination of applicants:
Issuance of registration certificates. Upon application as aforesaid the Board shall examine the

applicant as to his proficiency at any regular or special meeting of the Board. Such examination shall be thorough, practical, and sufficient to test the ability of the applicant in the practice of dentistry. It shall include both theory and practice. The theoretical portion shall include written or oral tests on operative and prosthetic dentistry, osteology, dental and general anatomy, histology, bacteriology, physiology, chemistry, metallurgy, materia medica, therapeutics, orthodontia, and anaesthetics. The clinical portion shall include demonstrations in operative and prosthetic dentistry, prognosis, and diagnosis. The Board may accept a certificate granted by the National Board of Dental Examiners in lieu of the theoretical portion of the examination. Reciprocal privileges in theory may be extended to those states who recognize and extend such privileges to dentists possessing a license to practice in the Territory of Alaska. Applicants must furnish their own material for demonstrations. Persons receiving a grade of seventy-five per cent (75%) at such examination shall be registered by the Board, and certificates of registration shall be issued to them, if otherwise qualified. The Secretary of the Board shall keep adequate records of such examinations in theory and practical demonstration of all applicants for a period of four years.

Section 5. Section 35-3-52 ACLA 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 35-3-52. (e) Expenses of Board members. The members of the Board shall receive travel expense and per diem for the time actually engaged in the duties of the Board. Such expenses shall be paid upon vouchers certified by the President and Secretary of the Board.

CHAPTER 85

AN ACT

[H. B. 117]

Relating to minority stockholder's suits and liability of action taken by minority stockholders where lawsuit fails; amending Section 36-1-106, ACLA 1949.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 36-1-106, ACLA 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 36-1-106. ACTIONS AGAINST AND BY STOCKHOLDERS.

Actions against stockholders.

(a) Except in case of insolvency or bankruptcy proceedings, no action shall be brought against a stockholder for any debt of the corporation, until judgment has been recovered against the corporation and an execution returned unsatisfied in whole or in part.

(b) A minority stockholder may bring suit against the corporation but must either own five per cent (5%) of the capital stock which must be put up as bond, or, file a bond equal to five per cent of the capital stock of the corporation but not more than \$1,000.00, which bond or stock shall be subject to forfeiture to the extent necessary to reimburse defendant for all costs taxed against plaintiff should stockholder's action fail.
