

Penalty. violate or fail to observe any of the terms of this Act, or any rule or regulation promulgated hereunder, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, be fined in a sum not less than Fifty Dollars nor more than \$500.00.

Severability clause. Section 8. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any provision of this Act, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Act and such application to other persons and circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

CHAPTER 87

AN ACT

[S. B. 93]

To provide for the control of predatory animals, to authorize cooperation with the United States in the control of such predatory animals, and to provide funds for that purpose.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Cooperation with Federal officials. Section 1. The Territorial Treasurer is authorized and directed to cooperate with the United States Department of the Interior, U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, in the control and destruction of wolves, coyotes and other predatory animals in this Territory in accordance with the organized and systematic plans of said U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service and for this purpose to enter into written agreements with said U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service covering the methods and procedure to be followed in such control.⁴

Expenditures. Section 2. All money appropriated to carry out the provisions of this Act shall be expended for equipment, materials, supplies, services or labor performed and other expenses necessary in the premises, payment for which shall be made by the Territorial Treasurer upon vouchers

approved by the duly authorized agent of said U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service in charge in the Territory. Such money shall be set apart in a special fund to be designated, "Predatory Animal Fund".

Predatory Animal
Fund created.

Section 3. Proceeds received from the sale of furs, skins and specimens taken by hunters whose compensation is paid out of funds appropriated under this Act shall be covered into said fund and be expended for the purposes herein set forth.

Deposits to fund.

Section 4. All Acts and parts of Acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 88

AN ACT

[C. S. H. B. 66]

Relating to the practice of nursing; creating a Nurses' Examining Board; defining its powers and duties; providing for the licensing and registration of nurses; fixing penalties for violations of the Act; repealing Sections 35-3-111 to 35-3-122, inclusive, ACLA 1949 and Chapter 28, Session Laws of Alaska 1949; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Definitions. As used in this Act, the following terms shall have the definitions shown unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

a. "Board" means the Nurses' Examining Board for the Territory of Alaska. Board.

b. "Registered Nurse" (R. N.) means a professional, trained, or graduate nurse, who performs any professional service requiring the application of principles of nursing based on biological, physical, and social sciences; the professional service shall include, but is not limited to, responsible supervision of a patient requiring skill in the Registered nurse.
