HOUSE MEMORIAL NO. 9

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR; THE DIRECTOR OF THE FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE AND THE DELEGATE TO CONGRESS FROM ALASKA:

Your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, in Twenty-first Session assembled, respectfully represents:

WHEREAS, it is in the national interest to promote and encourage the growth of year-round industry in the Territory of Alaska; and

WHEREAS, it has been the declared policy of the Interior Department to encourage local industry by requiring processing of raw materials in the area of production; and

WHEREAS, in violation of this policy, the fur seal pelts harvested annually on the Pribilof Islands in Alaska have been processed in St. Louis, Missouri, for many years,

NOW THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, in Twenty-first Session assembled, respectfully urges that the Secretary of the Interior take immediate action to require that all processing of fur seals from the Pribilof Islands be conducted in Alaska.
