

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 6

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS, the area in the Second Judicial Division south and north of Teller contains gold and many strategic minerals, including tin, and

WHEREAS, lack of proper road facilities has prevented the development of this area, and

WHEREAS, there is at present a road running fifteen miles south from Teller and a road known as the Sunset Road running ten miles north from Nome, with a missing link for a distance of forty-eight miles, and

WHEREAS, the development of the area will be retarded unless road facilities are furnished.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Territory of Alaska, the House of Representatives concurring, that a road be constructed by the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners for a distance of approximately forty-eight miles, to connect the present road known as the Sunset Road running ten miles north of Nome, with the present road running fifteen miles south from Teller; that surveys be undertaken as expeditiously as possible, and that the road be constructed with all possible speed and according to Territorial standards.
