

# LAWS OF ALASKA

## CHAPTER 1

### AN ACT

To name an official bird for the Territory of Alaska.

(H. B. 2)

#### PREAMBLE

WHEREAS, the Territorial Sportsmen, Inc., sponsored and the Alaska Sportsmen's Council actively supported and encouraged it; and

WHEREAS, through a contest conducted by the Territorial Department of Education and the Education Section of the Alaska Native

Service, the Willow Ptarmigan received by far the greatest number of votes; now therefore

**Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:**

Section 1. The Alaska Willow Ptarmigan (*Lagopus lagopus alascensis* Swarth) is hereby declared the official bird of the Territory of Alaska.

## CHAPTER 2

### AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$235,000 for transportation of school children in the biennium ending June 30, 1955; and declaring an emergency.

(H. B. 10)

**Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:**

Section 1. The sum of \$235,000, or so much thereof as may be found

necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the transportation of school pupils in the Territory for the biennium ending June 30, 1955. This appropriation shall be in addition to moneys heretofore appropriated for trans-

portation of school pupils during said biennium.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 3

### AN ACT

To repeal Chapter 1, Title 47, ACLA 1949, relating to the Act establishing the Alaska Planning Council.

(S. B. 11)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Chapter 1, Title 47, Alaska Compiled Laws Anno-

tated, 1949 (being Sections 47-1-1 through 47-1-5 inclusive) be repealed, and it is so enacted.

## CHAPTER 4

### AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$1,094.44 to pay Wilton Schwanke for teaching services performed for the Territory of Alaska; and declaring an emergency.

(H. B. 9)
