

## CHAPTER 26

## AN ACT

**Pertaining to the display of the flag of the United States and the flag of the Territory of Alaska; amending Section 1-1-3, ACLA, 1949.**

(H. B. 51)

**Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:**

Section 1. Section 1-1-3 ACLA 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

**Sec. 1-1-3. Official Flag: Adoption: Manner of Displaying.** The winning design of the Flag Contest held in 1927 by the American Legion, Department of Alaska, in the public, private and Native schools of the Territory, be and the same is hereby adopted as the official flag of Alaska.

The official flag of Alaska should be displayed with the flag of the United States only from sunrise to sunset, or between such hours as may be designated by proper authority; provided,

however, that said flags may be displayed after sunset upon special occasions when it is desired to produce a patriotic effect.

The flag of the United States and the flag of the Territory of Alaska should be displayed daily, weather permitting, on or near the main administration building of every institution under the authority or control of the Government for the Territory of Alaska.

The flag of the United States should be displayed in or near every polling place on properly designated election days.

Both flags should be displayed during school days in or near every schoolhouse.

## CHAPTER 27

## AN ACT

**Relating to the counting of ballots at Territorial primary and general elections.**

(H. B. 52)
