

CHAPTER 30

AN ACT

To appropriate \$10,500 as a deficiency appropriation to be used in paying School Boards and Physicians for physical examinations conducted during the biennium ending March 31, 1955; and setting an effective date.

(H. B. 69)

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

72 SLA 1953, for the biennium ending March 31, 1955.

Section 1. The sum of \$10,500.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated to reimburse school boards and physicians for physical examinations of school children as authorized by Section 37-7-11 ACLA 1949 as amended by Chapter 118 SLA 1949 and further amended by Chapter

Section 2. Expenditures under this Act shall be authorized by vouchers approved by the Commissioner of Health.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist. This Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 31

AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$10,000 for expenses of the Alaska National Guard for the biennium ending March 31, 1955; and declaring an emergency.

(H. B. 74)

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The sum of \$10,000, or so much thereof as may be found

necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the expenses of the Alaska National Guard for the biennium ending March 31, 1955. This appropriation shall be in addition to moneys

heretofore appropriated for said office for said biennium.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 32

### AN ACT

**Amending Section 58-1-2 ACLA 1949 on the subject of rights to inspect public records and to procure copies thereof.**

(C. S. for H. B. 31)

**Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:**

Section 1, Section 58-1-2 ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

**Sec. 58-1-2. Right to inspection and certified copy: Right to make copies of public records.** Every person has a right to inspect any public writing or record in said Territory, including public writings and records in recorders' offices, except records of vital statistics and adoption proceedings which shall be treated in the manner required by Section 21, Chapter 119, Session Laws of

Alaska of 1949, and every public officer having the custody thereof is bound to permit such inspection, and to give on demand and on payment of the legal fees therefor a certified copy of such writing or record, and such copy shall in all cases be evidence of the original. Recorders shall permit memorandums, transcripts, and copies of such public writings and records in their offices to be made by photography or otherwise for the purpose of examining titles to real estate described therein, making abstracts of title or guaranteeing or insuring the titles thereof, or build-
