

or a supplemental notice is filed in the same recording office within said six months period showing the recording date and the book and page or instrument number of the initial claim, the balance owing and the date to

which payment has been extended, then six months after the expiration of such extended period; provided, however, that no lien shall be continued in force for a longer time than one year from the date of the filing of the original lien notice.

## CHAPTER 51

### AN ACT

**To authorize city councils to provide by ordinance for impounding and disposing of abandoned personal property; amending Sec. 16-1-35, ACLA, 1949.**

(S. B. 53)

**Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:**

Section 1. Section 16-1-35, Alaska Compiled Laws Annotated, 1949, is hereby amended by adding a new subsection thereto to read as follows:

Twenty-Eighth. To provide by

ordinance for the impounding, recovery, sale or other disposition of abandoned personal property. The ordinance must provide that articles be held for at least 6 months for recovery by the owner, and for publication of notice at least once of any sale of such property or properties.
