

CHAPTER 55

AN ACT

To authorize the Alaska Office of Vocational Rehabilitation to station or place professional and clerical personnel within the continental United States for the purpose of extending services to eligible individuals under the Alaska Plan for Vocational Rehabilitation; and declaring an emergency.

(S. B. 107)

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Extending Services. Vocational rehabilitation services may be extended to the continental United States to all eligible individuals under the Alaska Plan for Vocational Rehabilitation.

Section 2. Authority to Station or Place Professional and Clerical Personnel Within the Continental United States. The Director of the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation

is hereby authorized to station or place professional or clerical personnel of the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation within the continental United States, in order to carry out vocational rehabilitation services for individuals eligible under the Alaska Plan for Vocational Rehabilitation.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 56

AN ACT

Authorizing school boards to declare a board vacancy when a member thereof is absent from three consecutive meetings without prior excuse; amending Title 37, Chapter 2, Article 4 thereof, ACLA 1949, by adding a new section 37-2-57.

(S. B. 117)

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Title 37, Chapter 2, Article 4 thereof, ACLA 1949, is amended by adding a new section, 37-2-57, to read as follows:

Sec. 37-2-57. Declaring a Board Vacancy. When a member of a school board of an incorporated, independent, or city school district, having been duly notified of the regular meeting of the

board, shall be absent from three (3) consecutive regular meetings without having been granted prior excuse by the President of the board, the other members of the board may, in their discretion, declare the position vacant and shall so notify the ex-member by registered mail; Provided, that the vacancy shall then be filled as otherwise provided in the law for the several types of school districts.

CHAPTER 57

AN ACT

To provide an additional retirement salary for all teachers who are receiving a retirement salary under the provisions of Territorial law, and prescribing an effective date.

(S. B. 131)

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Allowance for Service Retirement Salary Increase. Those teachers who are receiving a service retirement salary on July 1, 1955, under the provisions of Territorial Law, shall receive for life an additional Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per month payable on the first day of each month commencing August 1, 1955, Provided that all

teachers eligible for an additional retirement salary under the provisions of this Act shall have attained the age of sixty (60) years.

The additional retirement salary shall be paid from the Territorial School Tax Fund pursuant to vouchers approved by the Secretary of the Teachers' Retirement System.
