

the total cost and the pest is one that is or may become a public problem.

(b) To charter or hire on a custom basis the services of equipment and operators necessary for pest-control work when the persons directly affected are not able to provide the service and the pest is one that is or may become a public problem.

(c) To match Federal indemnity payments to livestock owners for livestock slaughtered under any

cooperating livestock health program.

(d) To maintain a supply of vaccines, serums and chemicals needed for emergency pest control, that are not commercially available in the Territory.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval, or upon its becoming law without such approval.

## CHAPTER 91

### AN ACT

**To appropriate One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) as a loan for the surveying, repairing and construction of airfields, to be expended under the direction of the Territorial Department of Aeronautics and Communications; and declaring an emergency.**

(H. B. 223)

**Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:**

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund as a loan, the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) for the surveying, repairing and construction of air fields, under the direction of the Territorial Department of Aeronautics and Commu-

nications. The aforesaid loan is to be repaid to the General Fund prior to June 30, 1956 as moneys become available from the aeronautical Revolving Fund.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
