WHEREAS, the Territory of Alaska is ready and able to assume responsibility of using and developing the public lands therein,

NOW THEREFORE, your Memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska urges that H. R. No. 246, now pending before the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States be passed and approved.

HOUSE MEMORIAL NO. 3

To the Commissioner of Education: outside toilet,

Your Memorialist, the House of Representatives of the Legislature of Alaska, respectfully represents:

WHEREAS, Talkeetna is a town on the Alaska Railroad of approximately 100 population, and

WHEREAS, the school facilities are inadequate and unsanitary, with

THEREFORE, we direct that you forthwith expend such sums as are necessary to provide an adequate indoor lavatory with running water. We further direct that this be done immediately and not next year.
