THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives that the Territorial Tax Commissioner be and he is hereby ordered to forthwith deliver to the Attorney General all documents and information in his possession upon which actions may be based to effect immediate recovery of approximately \$1,000,000.00 now due the Territory of Alaska under said act.

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 7

Be it Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska:

WHEREAS, There are not less than two hundred aircraft float ships situated on Lake Hood, near Anchorage, Alaska, and

WHEREAS, It is in the interests of safety that a short access road be constructed from the east side of Lake Hood around the north shore to the west side thereof, and

WHEREAS, At certain times of the year Lake Hood and Lake Spennard are low and dangerous to air traffic, and

WHEREAS, A short taxiway is needed connecting the west side of Lake Hood with International Airport, and

WHEREAS, A pull out ramp is badly needed on Lake Hood for itinerant traffic,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives that the Board of Aeronautics and the Director thereof be and they are hereby directed as follows:

1. To construct a road linking the east and west sides of Lake Hood by way of the north shore.

2. To install a headgate at the east end of Lake Spenard suitable to control water level.
3. To install a suitable pull out ramp on Lake Hood.
4. To construct a taxiway linking the west shore of Lake Hood with International Airport.

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 8

Be it Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska: visiting these villages once a month would prevent much pain, suffering and disease;

WHEREAS, the school teachers and others are inadequate to attend to their needs, and

WHEREAS, a public health nurse

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives that Dr. C. Earl Albrecht, Commissioner of Health, be and is hereby directed to assign one or more public health nurses to visit the villages without medical attention along the Yukon and Kuskokwim Rivers in the Fourth Division as often as practicable.
