

CHAPTER 103

AN ACT

Relating to the authority of incorporated cities to adopt nationally-recognized and Territorial codes by reference; amending Section 1 of Chapter 24, SLA 1955.

(H. B. 204)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 1 of Chapter 24, SLA 1955, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. Definitions. As used in this Act, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated, unless the context otherwise requires: (a) "City" means any incorporated city of the first or second class organized and operating under the general laws of the Territory of Alaska; (b) "Code" means any published compilation of rules and regulations which have been prepared by various nationally recognized technical trade associations or

organizations or by officers or agencies of the Territory of Alaska and shall include, but not by way of limitation, building codes; plumbing codes; electrical wiring codes; health or sanitation codes; fire prevention codes; inflammable liquids codes; codes for the slaughtering, processing and selling of meats and meat products for human consumption; codes for the production, pasteurizing and sale of milk and milk products; compilations and revisions of municipal ordinances and regulations; together with any other code which embraces rules and regulations pertinent to a subject which is a proper municipal legislative matter.

CHAPTER 104

AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$9,475.00 to the Department of Public Welfare to be expended for expenses and deficits occurring in certain programs during March of 1957; and declaring an emergency.

(H. B. 229)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. **Appropriation of \$9,475.00 to the Department of Public**

Welfare. The sum of \$9,475.00 is hereby appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare out of monies in the Territorial Treasury

not otherwise appropriated, and shall be expended for expenses and deficits occurring in the following programs for the month of March, 1957:

\$8,475.00 - General Relief—Medical Care Program—to restore percentage reductions in hospital and nursing home payments.

\$1,000.00 - Juvenile Code—to restore percentage reductions in boarding care payments.

Sec. 2. Money to be Expended in Normal Manner. The above monies shall be in addition to all other monies appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare and shall be disbursed and expended in the same manner and in accordance with the same procedures as monies are normally expended for said programs.

Sec. 3. Emergency. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 105

AN ACT

Relating to compulsory mining claim assessment work affidavits, and amending Sec. 47-3-55, ACLA 1949.

(S. B. 29)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Sec. 47-3-55, ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 47-3-55. Effect of Recording: Failure to Record Deemed Abandonment. The affidavit when recorded as provided in this Act (Secs. 47-3-30—47-3-34, 47-3-51, 47-3-53, 47-3-55—47-3-57 herein) shall be prima facie evidence of the performance of the work or of making the improvements therein stated. The failure to file for record the assessment work affidavit within six months after the close of the assessment

work year shall be deemed an abandonment of the claim and it shall then be subject to relocation by any other person, provided, however, that a compliance with the provisions of this Act before any relocation, shall operate to save the rights of the last locator, claimant or owner of said forfeited claim, and further provided, that if said claim has not been relocated by any other person or persons within one year after such forfeiture, the last locator, claimant or owner of such forfeited claim may return to said forfeited claim and relocate the same as though the same had never been located.
