

tion of data on the quantity, location and quality of waters of the Territory whether they be within the ground, on the surface of the ground, or along the coasts is hereby declared to be in the public interest and necessary to the orderly domestic and industrial development of Alaska.

Sec. 2. To expedite the systematic collection, recording, distribution and use of data on the waters of the Territory, the Alaska Department of Health is hereby authorized the following powers and duties:

(1) Collect, record, evaluate, and distribute data on the quantity, quality and location of underground, surface and coastal waters of Alaska.

(2) Publish or have published data on the waters of the Territory.

(3) Require the filing with the Alaska Department of Health of the results and findings of all surveys of water quality, quantity and location including water well drilling logs, pumping tests, flow measurements, type of aquifer, tidal currents and physical characteristics, and volume determinations.

(4) Accept and expend funds for the purposes of this act and to enter into agreements with individuals, public or private agencies, communities, private industry, Territorial agencies and agencies of the Federal government.

Sec. 3. The Alaska Board of Health is hereby authorized to promulgate regulations not inconsistent with existing law relating to and to provide for the systematic collection, recording and distribution of data on the waters of the Territory.

CHAPTER 156

AN ACT

To amend subsection Fifth (A) of Section 16-1-35 ACLA 1949, relating to powers of city councils.

(H. B. 230)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Subsection Fifth (A) of 16-1-35, ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Fifth: (A) (Roads and trails outside city: Parks and playgrounds.) To provide for the location and construction, for a limited extent, of trails and

roads outside the limits of the city, but leading to and from the same, where such roads and trails are necessary for promoting the welfare and prosperity of the city; and also to provide for the location, construction and maintenance of parks and playgrounds, either within the corporate limits of the city or within twenty-five miles of the exterior boundaries

thereof; but, no money shall be expended for such purposes except upon the unanimous vote of the entire council unless the qualified voters of the town, at

an annual or a special election, by a two-thirds vote of all those voting on the proposition have declared in favor of such expenditures.

CHAPTER 157

AN ACT

Authorizing the transfer of certain monies; allowing additional compensation to certain Legislative employees; authorizing the payment of additional and remaining Legislative expenses; amending Sec. 1 of Ch. 1, SLA 1957; and declaring an emergency.

(H. B. 240)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 1 of Chapter 1, SLA 1957, is hereby amended to provide that all unobligated balances in Subsections (1), (2), (3), (4) and (7) thereof as of the adjournment of the Regular Session of the Twenty-third Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, are transferred and placed in a new line item appropriation to be designated: "Additional Legislative Employees Compensation". Such monies shall be divided equally and be paid to those employees of the Senate and House employed under the Subsections set out above who are employed full time on the date of such adjournment.

Sec. 2. Section 1 of Chapter 1, SLA 1957, is hereby further amended to provide that all unobligated balances in Subsections (8), (9), (10), (11) and (13) thereof as of the adjournment of the Regular Session of the Twenty-third Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, are hereby transferred and placed in a

new line item appropriation to be designated: "Additional and Remaining Legislative Expenses". Such monies or so much thereof as shall be found necessary are hereby available for the following purposes:

(1) For the cleaning and repair of Legislative typewriters and mimeograph machines, the sum of...\$580.00

(2) For the reimbursement to the line appropriation designated "Other Expenses of Office" of the Attorney General for certain telephone services rendered the Legislature relating to House Bill No. 186, the sum of \$45.00

(3) For the payment of necessary additional telephone and Alaska Communication System services requested by the Twenty-third Legislature in Regular Session assembled, the sum of \$400.00

(4) For the payment of services necessary to index the 1957 Session Laws \$1000.00

(5) For the repair of Legislative furniture, to be made by George
