

CHAPTER 56

AN ACT

Relating to the criminal offense of inciting the commission of a crime; and amending Sec. 65-3-7, ACLA 1949.

(S. B. 49)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Sec. 65-3-7, ACLA 1949 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 65-3-7. **Inciting Commission of Crime.** That whoever shall wilfully and knowingly solicit, incite or induce another to commit any act declared to be a felony or a misdemeanor in this Territory, shall, if the act solicited, incited or induced is declared to be a felony, be deemed guilty of a felony and upon conviction

thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$3000 or by imprisonment for not more than three years, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and shall, if the act solicited, incited or induced is declared to be a misdemeanor, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500.00 or by imprisonment in the federal jail for not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

CHAPTER 57

AN ACT

Relating to domestic corporations; validating corporations previously organized; amending Section 36-1-11, ACLA 1949; and declaring an emergency.

(S. B. 83)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 36-1-11, ACLA 1949, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 36-1-11. **Persons Entitled to Incorporate: Purposes.** Three or more natural persons of full age may unite to form a stock corporation for any lawful business

purpose or purposes, whose chief business shall be in the Territory of Alaska.

Sec. 2. **Validating Corporations Previously Organized.** All banking corporations, insurance corporations, brokerage corporations, loan corporations or trust and guaranty associations heretofore incorporated under the laws of the Territory of

Alaska for the purpose of conducting any lawful business are hereby validated by this Act.

Sec. 3. **Emergency.** An emergency

is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 58

AN ACT

Authorizing the executive head of the University of Alaska to appoint deans, amending Section 37-10-7 ACLA 1949.

(S. B. 84)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 37-10-7, ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 37-10-7. Powers and Duties of Executive Head of University: Removal of Officers by Board: Suspension or Expulsion of Students. The executive head of the University of Alaska shall have authority subject to the approval of the Board of Regents to give general direction to the work of the institution in all its departments. He shall have power to appoint the deans, heads of departments and such other profes-

sors, assistants, instructors, tutors and other officers of the said University to the positions established by the Board of Regents and he shall define their duties and supervise the performance thereof. The Regents shall have power to remove from office any of the officers of the institution by a majority vote of the whole Board when in their judgment the good of the University requires it, provided, however, that the power to suspend and expel students for misconduct or other causes and to reinstate same is vested solely in the executive head of the University.

CHAPTER 59

AN ACT

Redefining "occupational diseases" for benefit purposes under the Fishermen's Fund; amending Section 5 of Chapter 100, SLA 1951, as amended by Chapter 99, SLA 1955.
