

(1) Any qualified nurse licensed in another state who is employed by the United States Government or any bureau, or agency, or division thereof, while in the discharge of her official duties; or

(2) Nursing service given temporarily in the event of a public emergency or disaster; or

(3) The practice of nursing by a student enrolled in a nursing education program accredited by the Board when such practice is in connection with the student's course of study.

Article X

Repeal

Ch. 88, SLA 1953, is hereby repealed.

Article XI

Severability

If any provision of this Act, or the application of such provision to any person or circumstance, shall be held invalid, the remainder of this Act or the application of such provision to persons or circumstances, other than those to which it is held invalid, shall not be affected thereby.

CHAPTER 91

AN ACT

Relating to the Alaska Visitors Association; amending Section 2 of Ch. 107, SLA 1951, as amended by Ch. 127, SLA 1953 and Ch. 168, SLA 1955.

(S. B. 79)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 2 of Ch. 107, SLA 1951, as amended by Ch. 127, SLA 1953 and Ch. 168, SLA 1955, is amended to read as follows:

Section 2. Territorial moneys in the amounts that shall be appropriated will be expended in Alaska, the United States and Canada for the purpose of promoting and publicizing Alaska's tourist attractions. Such advertising, publicity and promotional activities shall be produced, managed and distributed by or under the direction of the Alaska Visitors Association, a corporation organized under the laws

of the Territory of Alaska, for the purpose of promoting Alaska's tourist industry. Territorial moneys shall be issued to said Alaska Visitors Association by warrants of the Director of Finance for expenditure in accomplishing the purpose for which the corporation was organized; provided, however, such Territorial moneys shall be limited in any biennium to two times the amount contributed to and received by said association for such biennium from sources other than the Territory of Alaska. The Director of Finance shall audit the expenditure of such Territorial funds and the matching funds of the Alaska Visitors Association

and ascertain that they have been properly expended. The President or other authorized representative of the Alaska Visitors Association shall certify on each claim for payment of the Territorial moneys under this authority that the total of Territorial moneys expended up to that time and including that for which claim is made, does not exceed two times the total cash receipts of the Alaska Visitors Association from other sources for the current biennium; Provided, that no Territorial moneys issued hereunder shall be used to pay salaries, overhead, travel or other expenses of the Alaska Visitors Association, but shall go exclusively for display advertising space in magazines and newspapers of Alaska, the United States and/or Canada, the printing of pamphlets, booklets, folders and other graphic and pictorial publicity mater-

ial, designing and production costs in the preparation of such advertising and material; other supplies and materials needed to answer inquiries concerning Alaska and its attractions; designing and production costs of travel show materials and displays; distribution costs of such pamphlets, booklets, folders, other graphic and pictorial publicity, literature, travel show materials and displays; surveys relating to advertising media effectiveness and to tourism, for the purpose of promoting and developing the Alaska tourist industry and advertising and publicizing Alaska's tourist attractions as provided above.

Section 2. Funds to carry out the provisions of this Act may be appropriated in the General Appropriations Act of the Alaska Legislature.

CHAPTER 92

AN ACT

To permit cities, towns, other incorporated entities, or fire protection groups to make Mutual Aid agreements for fire protection purposes.

(S. B. 85)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Cities, towns, other incorporated entities, and other fire protection groups may organize mutual aid programs as follows: Cities, towns, other incorporated entities, or fire protection groups may adopt ordinances or resolutions authorizing and permitting

their respective fire departments, fire companies, emergency relief squads, fire police squads or fire patrols to go to the aid of another city, town, fire protection district, protected by a fire protection group, or territory outside of any of the foregoing, and while in performance of extending such aid, the department, companies, squads, and patrols and the members thereof shall
