

have the same immunities and privileges as if performing the same within their respective cities, towns, incorporated area or territory. Any such ordinance or resolution may authorize the head of the fire department to extend such aid, subject to such conditions and restrictions as may be prescribed

therein. Any agreement made under this Act shall be effectuated in such a manner that insurance rates shall not be increased nor shall such agreement reduce the liability of any insurance company in the event of a loss during the absence of men and equipment pursuant thereto.

AN ACT

Relating to service of jurors; amending Sec. 66-8-2, ACLA 1949.

(S. B. 95)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Sec. 66-8-2, ACLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 66-8-2. **Number of Jurors.** That the Grand Jury shall con-

sist of not less than sixteen nor more than twenty-three persons; provided, however, that any qualified member of the Grand Jury panel not designated to serve as a member of the Grand Jury may be placed on the Petit Jury panel.

Allowing municipalities to furnish sewage services outside municipalities; and amending Section 16-1-35; Subsection Fourth: ACLA 1949, as amended by Ch. 92, SLA 1949.

(S. B. 55)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 16-1-35; Subsection Fourth ACLA 1949, as

amended by Ch. 92, SLA 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 16-1-35; Sub-Section Fourth (Public Utilities) To pur-

chase, construct, or otherwise acquire, establish and operate public wharves, public sewers, public cold storage plants, telephone systems and plants for the use, sale and distribution of light, water, power, heat and telephone service and the collection and treatment of sewage for the residents of the city and the public. Provided, that any municipality which owns and/or operates plants for the use, sale or distribution of light, power, heat, water or telephone service to or the collection and treatment of sewage for the residents of the city may also sell and distribute such light, power, heat, water or telephone service to and collect and treat sewage for the residents

of contiguous and adjacent districts outside the limits of the city, and for that purpose may construct, purchase or otherwise acquire, own, maintain and operate extensions, pole line, mains, pipe lines and other necessary apparatus and equipment therefor, together with the real property necessary for the same, outside the limits of the city. Provided, however, such public utilities as are provided for in this sub-section shall not be operated or maintained by funds raised by taxation but from the revenue collected for service rendered by such plants or utilities from the customers or users thereof, except that this proviso need not apply to public sewers.

Relating to the Alaska Motor Vehicle Act; amending Subsections (3) and (5) of Section 1, Ch. 124, SLA 1951, as amended by Sections 1 and 2 of Ch. 59, SLA 1953; and amending the first paragraph of Sec. 5, Ch. 124, SLA 1951 as amended by Sec. 2, Ch. 73, SLA 1953.

(H. B. 37)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Subsection (3) of Section 1, Ch. 124, SLA 1951, as amended by Section 1, Ch. 59, SLA 1953, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

(3) "Dealer" shall be taken to mean and include but not limited to every franchised dealer, second hand dealer, used car dealer or other person engaged in the

business of buying, selling, or exchanging new or used vehicles of a type required to be registered hereunder who has an established place of business and who is duly licensed under the provisions of the Alaska Business License Act, Ch. 43, SLA 1949, for such purposes in this Territory; and any said dealer who has an established place of business and is licensed as herein provided who sells any such vehicle shall be
