HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 3

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska in Regular Session Assembled:

WHEREAS, the Probate Code of the Territory of Alaska is cumbersome, outmoded, and often fails to protect the best interests of the estates and heirs of decedents; and

WHEREAS, a number of states have enacted progressive legislation in this field;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RE-

SOLVED, that the Twenty-Third Legislature in regular session assembled direct the Legislative Council, after due study and consideration to prepare a bill providing a new Probate Code to be completed not later than the date of convening of the Twenty-Fourth Legislature.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 4

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

WHEREAS, under the Labor Management Relations Act of 1947, commonly known as the Taft-Hartley Act, the states and territories of the United States are permitted to enact legislation prohibiting agreements which require membership in a labor organization as a condition of employment; and

WHEREAS, as a result thereof many jurisdictions have enacted so called "open-shop" statutes to the great detriment of all organized working men; and

WHEREAS, the American laborer has struggled and suffered untold setbacks and hardships to attain his rightful place in the labor world; and

WHEREAS, Section 14 (b) of the

Taft-Hartley Act does not guarantee such protection and enjoyment,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, the Senate concurring, that we respectfully urge the repeal of Sec. 14 (b) of the said Labor Management Relations Act, 1947 (29 U.S.C. Sec. 164 (b)), permitting the adoption of such discriminatory legislation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this Resolution be sent to the President of the United States, the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America, and the Delegate to Congress for Alaska.
