HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 1

Be it Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska in Regular Session Assembled:

WHEREAS Almighty God, in his wisdom, has called unto himself Mrs. Elton E. (Thelma) Engstrom, and has brought surcease to her suffering, and

WHEREAS she leaves to mourn her passing, her husband, Senator Elton E. Engstrom and sons, Elton, Jr., and Allan Engstrom, and other relatives, and

WHEREAS her untimely death has brought sorrow not only to the citizens of Juneau, but also to many others throughout the Territory, and

WHEREAS Mrs. Engstrom was a member of this House of Representatives during the 1947 session, and her service is still remembered,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved, that our adjournment this afternoon serve to express our profound sympathy, and honor to the memory of Former Representative Thelma Engstrom, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution be spread upon the pages of this day's journal; that the original be addressed to Senator Engstrom and his sons; and that copy be mailed to a sister, Mrs. Solon Dore, of Juneau.

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 2

Be it Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska:

WHEREAS, substantial growth in the population of Alaska has led to an increased market demand for agricultural commodities; and

WHEREAS, the cost of shipping such commodities to Alaska from the States has increased considerably in the past few years; and

WHEREAS, these developments have heightened interest in possible prospects for expanded agricultural land use in the Territory, especially in areas adjacent to pop-

ulation centers; and

WHEREAS, the Western Kenai Peninsula is one such area which has a high potential for use as agricultural land;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska that the University of Alaska through its Agricultural Department, is hereby directed to study the possibility of establishing an agricultural experimental station on the Kenai Peninsula.

Passed by the House March 8, 1957.
