CHAPTER 14

AN ACT

To appropriate funds for the payment of bounty deficiencies; and providing for an effective date.

(C.S.H.B. 22)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. The following sums of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, respectively, are hereby appropriated for present and anticipated 1958-1959 fiscal year deficiency:

CHAPTER 15

AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for examination expenses of the Real Estate Commission for the biennium ending June 30, 1959; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 6)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. The sum of \$1,500.00 is hereby appropriated out of any monies

in the General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the expenses of the Real Estate Commission for the purpose of holding real estate examinations before the end of the current fiscal year or June 30, 1959. This appropriation shall be in addition to monies heretofore ap-

propriated for the said commission for the biennium ending June 30, 1959.

Sec. 2. This Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval, or upon its becoming law without such approval.

CHAPTER 16

AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of Public Welfare to transfer the sum of \$76,000.00 from an unobligated balance in the Old Age Assistance fund to the Juvenile Code Program for the purpose of paying, for the remainder of the biennium 1957-1959, board and care and incidental needs of children committed to the Department of Public Welfare; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 21)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. The Department of Public Welfare is hereby authorized to transfer the amount of \$76,000.00 from an unobligated balance in the Old Age Assist-

ance fund to the Juvenile Code fund where there exists a deficit.

Sec. 2. This Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval, or upon its becoming law without such approval.

CHAPTER 17

AN ACT

Relating to prohibiting fish traps on lands owned by the State of Alaska; providing for restrictive covenants in the sale or lease of such lands; defining violations; prescribing penalties; repealing Ch. 154, SLA 1955; and providing an effective date.

(S.B. 4)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to erect, moor, or maintain fish traps, including but not limited to floating, pile driven or hand driven fish traps, on or over any lands or tidelands owned or hereafter acquired by the State of Alaska. Nothing in this section shall prevent the maintenance, use or operation of small, hand-driven fish traps of the type ordinarily used on rivers of Alaska which are otherwise legally maintained and operated in or above the mouth of any stream or river in Alaska.

Sec. 2. The lease or sale of any such State lands or tidelands shall contain a restrictive covenant in keeping with the intent of this Act.

Sec. 3. A violation of this Act shall be a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by imprisonment not to exceed six months or by fine not to exceed \$1,000.00 or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 4. Ch. 154, SLA 1955 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 5. This Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval or upon its becoming law without such approval.
