Sec. 11. Failure to Make Reports: Additional Tax: Notice: Penalty for Delinquency. Whenever any licensee shall fail to make a report of any contest within the time prescribed by this Act or when such report is unsatisfactory to the commission or to the Department of Revenue, the secretary shall examine the books and records of such licensee; he may subpoena and examine under oath any officer of such licensee and such other person or persons as he may deem necessary to a determination of the total gross receipts from any contest and the amount of tax thereon. If, upon the completion of such examination, it shall be determined that an additional tax is due, notice thereof shall be served upon the licensee, and if such licensee shall fail to pay such additional tax within twenty days after service of such notice such delinquent licensee shall forfeit its license and shall forever be disqualified from receiving any new license and in

addition thereto such licensee and the members thereof shall be jointly and severally liable to this state in the penal sum of \$1,000.00 to be collected by the attorney general by civil action in the name of the state in the manner provided by law.

Sec. 12. Penalty for Conducting Contests Without License. Any person, club, corporation, organization, association or fraternal society conducting within this state boxing, sparring or wrestling contests or exhibitions without having first obtained a license therefor in the manner provided by this Act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 13. General Penalty. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Act for which no penalty is provided in this Act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 14. Effective Date. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 158

AN ACT

Establishing a board of electrical examiners; providing for the licensing of electrical contractors; providing fees and penalties; and providing for an effective date.

(C.S.H.B. 311)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. There is hereby created a Board of Electrical Examiners which shall consist of three members all of whom shall be persons who are licensed electrical contractors as hereinafter defined. The members of the board shall be appointed by the governor and confirmed by the legislature for staggered terms of three years, or until their successors are appointed, and may be removed at the pleasure of the governor. The board shall elect one of its members as chairman.

Sec. 2. The board shall hold a regular annual meeting and may hold special meetings at the call of the chairman of the board with prior approval of the governor. Two members shall consti-

tute a quorum. The board shall issue rules and regulations, subject to the Administrative Procedure Act, relating to the examination and licensing of electrical contractors as provided in subparagraph d. of section 3, and the suspension or revocation of such licenses pursuant to section 4 a. hereof. Licensing examinations, under the supervision of the chairman of the board or his designee, shall be conducted at least twice during each year at any appropriate places in the state.

Sec. 3. a. The term "Electrical Contractor" shall mean any person, firm, partnership or corporation engaged in the business of, or purporting to be engaged in the business of, installing or repairing, or contracting to install or repair, any electrical wiring, conduits, de-

VICES, FIXTURES, EQUIPMENT OR OTHER ELECTRICAL MATERIALS FOR TRANSMITTING, USING OR CONSUMING ELECTRICAL ENERGY.

b. The term "Electrical Wiring" shall mean and include all wiring, fixtures, conduits, appliances, devices, equipment, overhead or underground wiring systems, or any other equipment in connection with the general distribution or utilization of electrical energy.

c. No person, firm, partnership or corporation shall act as an electrical contractor in Alaska without first being licensed by the board.

d. Application for a license, and supporting information, shall be made and given in such form as the board shall prescribe. Each person applying shall be examined to determine his knowledge of electrical installations and wiring, familiarity with the regulations as laid down in the National Electrical Code and the National Electrical Safety Code, both as approved by the American Standards Association, other installation and safety regulations approved by the American Standards Association, and his personal skill and ability.

e. Each applicant, other than an individual, shall designate a supervisory employee or member of the firm to take the required examination, who shall be designated as administrator under the license. No person may qualify as administrator under more than one license. If the relationship of the administrator with the firm or corporation applicant is terminated, the license shall become void within ninety days unless another administrator is qualified by the board. Licenses issued hereunder shall be valid for one year after issuance, unless sooner revoked or suspended; are non-transferable; and may be renewed without further examination by appropriate application.

f. Each successful applicant for examination shall receive an appropriate certificate of license which shall thereafter be prominently displayed, while in effect, in the holder's principal place of business. Each applicant shall pay an original license fee of \$100.00; the fee for renewal shall be \$50.00. Applicants who have been engaged in the electrical contracting business in Alaska for one year or more prior to the effective date

of this Act, shall upon making satisfactory showing of qualifications to the board, be licensed without examination.

Sec. 4. a. The board may suspend or revoke any license upon a finding that:

(1) The application therefor is fraudulent or misleading.

(2) The licensee has knowingly violated this Act or any lawful rule, order or regulation of the board.

(3) The licensee is incompetent, or has engaged in fraudulent practices.

b. Notice of any proposed suspension or revocation of license shall be given in writing, stating the grounds therefor; all proceedings shall be governed by the provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act.

Sec. 5. The board may make or cause to be made any special inspection or investigation into the work of any licensee which may be deemed necessary, and shall have the power to issue subpoenas and process compelling the attendance of any person and the production of any papers or books, for the purpose of such investigation and examination, and shall have the power to administer oaths when required, and to petition any court of this state to enforce such subpoenas and process or to compel such testimony.

Sec. 6. Members of the board shall receive such payments, per diem allowances and transportation expenses as are allowed and paid members of other state examining and licensing boards.

Sec. 7. The budgeting, clerical and recording functions of the Board of Electrical Examiners is assigned to the Department of Commerce.

Sec. 8. No person, firm, partnership or corporation engaged in (a) electrical construction and maintenance of electrical wiring for the generation and distribution of electrical current where such wiring is an integral part of a system owned and operated by a public service corporation or the light and power department of a municipality and the work is performed by the employees of that public utility or municipality; (b) the operation, maintenance, or repair of tele-

phone, telegraph, signal or communication systems, or of a television or radio broadcasting station; or (c) the manufacture or repair of electrical apparatus or equipment shall be subject to this Act.

Sec. 9. No person is required to obtain an electrical contractor's license to make an electrical installation on residential property which is owned by the installer or a member of his immediate family and not intended for sale at the time of making the installation.

Sec. 10. Any person or persons who

shall knowingly violate any of the provisions of this Act, or who shall knowingly violate any valid rule, regulation or order of the board, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof may be fined not more than \$300.00, or may be imprisoned for not more than 60 days, or may be both fined and imprisoned.

Sec. 11. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 159

AN ACT

Relating to registration of motor vehicle dealers; amending Sec. 5, Ch. 135, SLA 1959; adding a new section to Ch. 135, SLA 1959; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 395)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. Sec. 5, Ch. 135, SLA 1959, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 5. **Bond.** (1) Every applicant for a dealer's registration or for the renewal of such dealer's registration shall file with the application or request for renewal, and shall thereafter maintain in force while so registered, a bond, in favor of the State of Alaska, executed by an authorized corporate surety approved by the Commissioner of Revenue, in the amount of \$10,000.00, or in lieu thereof the Commissioner may, in his sole discretion, accept a bond in that amount with at least two individual sureties, each justifying with real property in twice the amount of the bond. In the event a bond with individual sureties is offered, the Commissioner shall make such investigation as may be necessary to determine the actual financial responsibility of such sureties. The bond shall be conditioned that the applicant will conduct his business in accordance with the provisions of this Act and will not commit fraud or make fraudulent representations in the course thereof. (2) Any such bond shall be held in the office of

the Commissioner of Revenue and shall remain in force until the surety or sureties are released from the liability by the Commissioner, or until the bond is cancelled by the surety or sureties as set forth herein. Without prejudice to any liability accrued prior to cancellation, the surety or sureties may cancel the bond upon thirty days advance notice in writing filed with the Commissioner, and the Commissioner shall cancel such bond six months after receipt of notice in writing from the surety or sureties that the dealer has ceased to do such business in the state.

Sec. 2. Ch. 135, SLA 1959 is amended by adding a new Sec. 7 to read as follows:

Sec. 7. **Penalties.** Any dealer failing to register and file a bond as required by this Act by December 31 of each year shall pay a penalty of \$100.00. Any dealer wilfully violating any provision of this Act shall be deemed to have committed a misdemeanor thereby, and upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$300.00.

Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
