CHAPTER 55

AN ACT

Relating to the duties of the purchasing agent; amending Sec. 1 (9), Art. IV, Ch. 82, SLA 1955; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 288)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. Sec. 1 (9), Art. IV, Ch. 82, SLA 1955 is amended to read as follows:

(9) Provide for such other matters as may be necessary to carry out the

provisions of this Act and the rules and regulations promulgated hereunder.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 56

AN ACT

Appropriating current federal transitional grants from the general fund; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 305)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. **Legislative Intent.** The legislature recognizes that the federal transitional grants made available to the State of Alaska during the current period have been paid into the general fund of the state, and that it is necessary to specifically appropriate them to the functions and purposes intended by the federal government. During the interim between the first and second sessions of the First State Legislature the governor made the necessary appropriations as authorized by Ch. 177, SLA 1959. This gubernatorial authority expired upon the convening of the second session, and it is the intent of this appropriation bill to make the needed appropriations of current transitional grants.

Sec. 2. The sum of \$7,812,500 is appro-

riated out of the federal transitional grants in the general fund of the state according to the following schedules:

To the grant-in-aid fund for disease and sanitation investigation and control for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1960	\$ 158,000

Revolving fund: (1) for preliminary unallocated right-of-way acquisition and engineering expenses; and (2) to cover necessary expenses of the Federal Highway Aid Program prior to the reimbursement from the federal government \$1,798,373

Total, Division of Highways \$3,974,500

Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 57

AN ACT

Establishing a special contingency fund for processing applications for purchase and lease of state lands; amending Art. II, Sec. 5 (10), Ch. 169, SLA 1959; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 380)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. Sec. 5 (10), Art. II, Ch. 169, SLA 1959 is amended to read as follows:

(10) Account for all fees, licenses, taxes or other monies received in the administration of the Act from any source including the sale or leasing of any land, identify their source, and promptly transmit them to the proper fiscal department after crediting them to the proper fund. Receipts from land application filing fees and charges for

copies of maps and records shall be covered by the director into a special contingency fund. This fund shall be used to cover necessary expenses of processing applications for the purchase and lease of state lands, and it shall be allocated by the governor to the division of lands as needed. Any unallocated fund balance in excess of \$10,000.00 at the end of any fiscal year will revert to the general fund.

Sec. 2. This Act shall be in effect July 1, 1960.

CHAPTER 58

AN ACT

Appropriating \$106,000 from the Highway Fund to the Department of Public Works for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1960; and providing for an effective date.
