

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 51

Relating to continued planning for construction of the Bradley Lake hydroelectric project.

Be it Resolved by the House in First Legislature, Second Session assembled, the Senate concurring:

WHEREAS, electric power facilities in the lower Kenai area are presently overloaded and even greater demands for electric power are in sight; and

WHEREAS, economic forecasts for the Kenai indicate that it would be eminently suitable for electroprocess industries, provided that sufficient power now potentially available is made actually available; and

WHEREAS, private power companies have expressed complete disinterest in constructing hydroelectric projects in the

area; and

WHEREAS, a preliminary study of the Bradley Lake hydroelectric project indicates that it will have a minimum capacity of some 48,000 kilowatts;

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives in First Legislature, Second Session assembled, the Senate concurring that the construction of the Bradley Lake hydroelectric project is essential for the economic growth of the lower Kenai and that the Congressional delegation from Alaska should do all in its power to further the planning for the construction of this project; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be directed to the Congressional delegation from Alaska.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 54

Relating to the establishment of an institute of marine sciences.

Be it Resolved by the House in First Legislature, Second Session assembled, the Senate concurring:

WHEREAS, the University of Alaska has completed its study on the proposed establishment of an institute of marine sciences; and

WHEREAS, the results of that study

indicate that the establishment of an institute of marine sciences is not only feasible but also desirable;

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives in First Legislature, Second Session assembled, the Senate concurring, that the University of Alaska proceed to establish an institute of marine sciences as authorized by law.

Representatives, the Senate concurring, that the time limit of transmission of bills as stipulated in Uniform Rules 64 be extended to allow for the receipt of bills in the other house up to and including the 51st day of this Second Session of the First State Legislature.
